Provides relative to rights of victims of alleged delinquent acts

<u>Current law</u> provides that courts should provide secure waiting areas in cases involving violent crime and during court proceedings that do not require victims and their legal representatives be in close proximity to accused children and their families and friends. <u>Proposed law</u> amends <u>current law</u> to mandate that the victim or designated member of the victim's family (VDMVF) has the right to be present at all court proceedings in cases involving homicide or injury to a minor (HITM) and, when practical, be allowed to observe the proceedings by simultaneous transmission through audiovisual equipment, if the technology is available in the courtroom. <u>Current law</u> allows a district attorney (DA) the discretion to release to the VDMVF of a delinquent act which is a crime of violence (COV) information regarding the results of adjudication and disposition hearings (ADH), notice of custody or release of the offender, advanced notice of court proceedings, and certain information in predisposition reports. <u>Proposed law</u> mandates that the DA release this and additional information; amends <u>current law</u> by removing the requirement that a VDMVF make a request to a DA prosecuting felony-grade offenses to provide their input to the DA regarding the disposition (DP) of a delinquency case and mandates that the DA, whenever practical, consult the VDMVF regarding the DP of a delinquency case involving HITM; raises the age of a juvenile crime victim from 17 to 18 years of age.
