HOUSE BILL NO. 139

APPROPRIATIONS/JUDGMENT: Appropriates funds for payment of the consent judgment against the state in the suit entitled Ron Kendrick v. State of Louisiana, et al.

1 AN ACT

2 To appropriate monies out of the state general fund for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 to be used to
3 pay the consent judgment captioned "Ron Kendrick versus State of Louisiana
4 through the Department of Transportation, Development, and Walmart Stores East,
5 Inc." between the state of Louisiana, through the Department of Transportation and
6 Development, and Ron Kendrick; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for
7 related matters.

8 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

9 Section 1. The sum of Fourteen Thousand and No/100 (\$14,000) Dollars is hereby
10 payable out of the State General Fund (Direct) for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 for payment of the
11 consent judgment captioned "Ron Kendrick versus State of Louisiana through the
12 Department of Transportation, Development, and Walmart Stores East, Inc.", signed on
13 September 6, 2023, between the state of Louisiana, through the Department of
14 Transportation and Development, and Ron Kendrick, bearing Number 2016-08561, Division
15 J, on the docket of the Civil District Court for the parish of Orleans, state of Louisiana.

16 Section 2. The judgment may only be paid from this appropriation if it is final and
17 shall be paid as to principal, interest, court costs, and expert witness fees as awarded in the
18 judgment. If the provisions of the judgment conflict with the provisions of this Act, the
19 provisions of the judgment shall be controlling. Any other provision of this Act not in
20 conflict with the provisions of the judgment shall control. Payment shall be made only after

1 presentation to the state treasurer of documentation required by the state treasurer. Further,
2 the judgment shall be deemed to have been paid on the effective date of this Act, and interest
3 shall cease to run as of that date.

4 Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
5 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
6 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
7 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
8 effective on the day following such approval.

Proposed law provides relative to payment. Provides relative to conflicts between the judgment and proposed law. Prohibits accrual of interest on the judgment as of the effective date of proposed law.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
