1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:5.5.3, relative to seafood safety; to provide for the
3	modernization of the Seafood Safety Task Force; to provide for an updated mission
4	and purpose; to provide for enhanced areas of study; to provide for annual reporting;
5	to provide for updated membership; to provide for the election of a chairman; to
6	provide for subcommittees; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for
7	related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 40:5.5.3 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
10	§5.5.3. Seafood Safety Task Force; creation; purpose
11	A. Within the Louisiana Department of Health there is hereby created the
12	Seafood Safety Task Force, hereafter referred to as "task force". The task force shall
13	serve as the state panel of experts focused on ensuring the safety of seafood
14	processed, distributed, purchased, and consumed in Louisiana, the education
15	and awareness of consumers regarding the dangers of imported seafood, as well
16	as pursuing initiatives to support and sustain the commercial seafood industry.
17	<u>B.</u> The task force shall be charged with obtaining studying all of the

2	(1) the <u>The</u> method in which the imported seafood is inspected in Louisiana; $\frac{1}{2}$

5	including but not limited to malachite green, oxytetracycline, fluoroquinolone,
6	<u>and nitrofurantoin ; and.</u>

8	imported seafood.
9	(5) The harmful effects of antibody resistence due to consumption of
10	imported seafood.
11	(6) The most effective methods of education and awareness to alert the

14	(7) The most effective methods of supporting the commercial seafood
15	industry in Louisiana, including but not limited to preserving the culture and
16	heritage of Louisiana seafood and protecting our waters from contaminated
17	<u>foreign bait shrimp.</u>
18	(8) The amount of fines and penalties imposed by the Louisiana
19	Department of Health, Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry, and
20	Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and whether the fines and
21	penalties are functioning as a successful deterrent or if they need to be
22	increased.
23	(9) The many laws of the state regarding the seafood industry to ensure
24	that they are updated and modernized to continue to protect consumers of
25	seafood.
26	(10) Any other matter considered appropriate by the members of the
27	task force or as requested by the legislature, governor, or state agency with
28	responsibility for seafood safety.
29	$\underline{\mathbf{C}}$. The task force shall compile the results of these findings $\underline{\mathbf{annually}}$ and

1	shall develop seafood and safety recommendations to be reported to the House
2	Committee on Health and Welfare, the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare, the
3	House Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, Aquaculture, and Rural Development,
4	and the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Forestry, Aquaculture, and Rural
5	Development by March 1, 2010 governor and the legislature no later than
6	February first of each year.
7	B.D. The task force shall be composed of the following <u>sixteen</u> members:
8	(1) A member appointed by <u>the</u> chairman of the House Committee on Health
9	and Welfare who shall serve as chair of the task force or his designee.
10	(2) A member appointed by <u>the</u> chairman of the Senate Committee on Health
11	and Welfare or his designee .
12	(3) The commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Forestry or his
13	designee.
14	(4) The chancellor of the Louisiana State University Agricultural Center or
15	his designee.
16	(5) A representative of the Louisiana Poison Control Center Louisiana
17	Seafood Promotion and Marketing Board.
18	(6) The secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health or his designee.
19	(7) A representative of the United States Food and Drug Administration
20	Louisiana Shrimp Task Force.
21	(8) A representative of the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation.
22	(9) The secretary of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries or his designee.
23	(10) The secretary of the Department of Environmental Quality or his
24	designee.
25	(11) A representative of the Louisiana Restaurant Association.
26	(12) A public health nutritionist.
27	(13) A commercial fisherman appointed by the governor.
28	(14) A commercial fisheries processor appointed by the governor.
29	(15) A representative of the Louisiana Crawfish Promotion and Research

2	(16) A representative of the Louisiana Retailers Association.
3	C. E. The task force shall convene for its first meeting no later than January
4	15, 2010 at least quarterly. At this meeting the first meeting of each calendar
5	year, the members shall elect a vice chairman and other officers as they deem
6	<u>consider</u> appropriate.
7	D. <u>F.</u> The task force shall meet at such times and at places <u>throughout the</u>
8	state as it may designate to ensure participation. Meetings shall be held at the call
9	of the chairman or at the call of a quorum of members upon not less than seven days
10	notice. A majority of a quorum shall be present to transact any business. The
11	members of the task force shall not be compensated for their services on the task
12	force but may seek travel reimbursements from their respective agencies under their
13	respective guidelines. Meetings of the task force shall be subject to laws regarding
14	open meetings, and records of the task force shall be subject to laws regarding public
15	records.
16	E. G.(1) The chair of the task force may appoint committees to fulfill the
17	purposes of the task force. The chair of the task force shall appoint the chair of any
18	committee and shall designate the functions and responsibilities of each committee
19	appointed.
20	(2) Committees may include but not be limited to a committee to
21	facilitate coordination with other coastal or seafood producing states in the
22	United States, a committee on coordination with the Louisiana Congressional
23	delegation and the bipartisan American Seafood Caucus, and a committee on
24	promoting jobs and professional interest in commercial fisheries.
25	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
26	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
27	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
28	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
29	effective on the day following such approval.

<u>Present law</u> establishes the Seafood Safety Task Force within the Louisiana Department of Health as a 12 member task force charged with obtaining certain information regarding imported seafood and reporting the information to certain legislative committees by March 1, 2010.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides updates to the task force membership, expands the mission and purpose of the task force, and provides for ongoing annual reporting to the legislature and governor.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the task force to appoint committees to fulfill the purposes of the task force.

Proposed law identifies specific committees the task force may establish.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
