PUBLIC HEALTH. Creates the office of violence prevention in the Louisiana Department of Health. (8/1/24)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 36:251(C)(1) and to enact R.S. 36:258(M) and Part I-B of
3	Chapter 11 of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised
4	of R.S. 40:2025.1 through 2025.3, relative to the creation of the office of violence
5	prevention within the Louisiana Department of Health; to provide for purposes and
6	functions of the office; to provide for legislative intent; to provide for reporting; to
7	provide for authorized sources of funding; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 36:251(C)(1) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 36:258(M)
10	is hereby enacted to read as follows:
11	§251. Louisiana Department of Health; creation; domicile; composition; purpose
12	and functions
13	* * *
14	C.(1) The Louisiana Department of Health shall be composed of the
15	executive office of the secretary, the office of management and finance, the office
16	of public health, the office of behavioral health, the office for citizens with
17	developmental disabilities, the office of aging and adult services, the office on

1	women's health and community health, the office of violence prevention, and such
2	other offices as shall be created by law.

4	§258. Offices; purposes and functions
5	* * *
6	M. The office of violence prevention shall be responsible for leading and
7	coordinating efforts of the state relative to violence prevention research and
8	making policy recommendations to reduce violence in the state.
9	Section 2. Part I-B of Chapter 11 of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of
10	1950, comprised of R.S. 40:2025.1 through 2025.3, is hereby enacted to read as follows:
11	PART I-B. OFFICE OF VIOLENCE PREVENTION
12	§2025.1. Legislative intent
13	The legislature of the state of Louisiana declares that violence shall be
14	recognized and addressed as a public safety and health crisis utilizing a public
15	safety and health data-based approach taking into consideration all of the
16	following:
17	(1) The specifics of violence, including crimes of violence, gang violence,
18	and domestic violence in each community, including but not limited to
19	identification of those most affected, identification of contributing factors, and
20	identification of factors creating greater safety for those most affected by
21	violence in each community.
22	(2) The root causes of violence in the community, including but not
23	limited to poverty, lack of quality education, lack of affordable housing, food
24	insecurity, unemployment, untreated trauma, and the evaluation of community
25	conditions. Evaluation of community conditions includes the comparison of
26	community conditions and opportunities for communities with a high risk of
27	violence and those with a lesser risk of violence in order to identify and create
28	greater safety for high-risk communities through community surroundings. For

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the purposes of this Part, community surroundings include but are not limited

1	to streets, parks, schools, community-based organizations, youth and
2	community centers, and places of worship.
3	(3) A commitment for violence prevention efforts to focus on addressing
4	and healing individual, interpersonal, and community trauma inflicted as a
5	result of violence.
6	§2025.2. Office of violence prevention; purpose; plan of action
7	A. There is hereby established within the Louisiana Department of
8	Health, the office of violence prevention, which shall exercise the powers and
9	duties set forth in this Part or otherwise provided by law.
10	B. The purpose of the office shall be to develop a strategy through
11	collaboration with other state agencies, as well as members of various
12	communities including but not limited to youth, trusted community messengers,
13	community-based organizations, faith leaders, grassroots organizers, political
14	leaders, business owners, and other organizations and individuals with expertise
15	in the field to identify causes of violence in a community, promote strategies
16	supporting conflict resolution, and incorporate a public safety and health
17	approach to improve social determinants of safety and health for communities
18	most affected by violence.
19	C. The office shall submit an initial written plan of action to the
20	legislature, no later than February 1, 2026, detailing how the office will
21	incorporate a public safety and health approach to any violence
22	prevention-related programs and services.
23	D. In creating the plan of action required by Subsection C of this Section,
24	the office shall collaborate with those impacted by violence to identify and
25	evaluate innovative and successful community-based violence prevention
26	programs and focus on how any proposed programs and services may address
27	trauma in communities with a high degree of violence.
28	E. The office may collaborate with institutions of higher learning and
29	nongovernmental organizations to collect and evaluate information in

1 developing the office's strategy and recommendations to combat violence in this 2 state. 3 §2025.3. Sources of funding authorized 4 The office may receive and expend funds as may be necessary to carry out the requirements of this Part including but not limited to funds 5 appropriated by the legislature, including any appropriation of federal funds, 6 7 and any public or private donations, gifts, or grants from governmental sources, 8 individuals, corporations, nonprofit organizations, business entities, and any 9 other lawful source.

SB 479 Original

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the office of violence prevention within the Louisiana Department of Health to lead and coordinate efforts of the state relative to violence prevention research and to make policy recommendations to reduce violence in the state.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the duties and functions of the office, including reporting to the legislature.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for sources of funds that may be utilized by the office.
