BY REPRESENTATIVES HORTON, CARLSON, CARVER, DICKERSON,
EDMONSTON, OWEN, AND TAYLOR AND SENATORS BASS AND HODGES

SCHOOLS: Requires the display of the Ten Commandments in public schools

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 17:2122 and 3996(B)(82), relative to public elementary, secondary, and
3 postsecondary schools; to require display of the Ten Commandments in each
4 classroom; to provide relative to the use of public funds for this purpose; to provide
5 for applicability to charter schools; to provide for an effective date; and to provide
6 for related matters.

7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

8 Section 1. R.S. 17:2122 and 3996(B)(82) are hereby enacted to read as follows:

9 §2122. Ten Commandments; displays

10 A.(1) Each public school governing authority shall display the Ten
11 Commandments in each building it uses and classroom in each school under its
12 jurisdiction. The nature of the display shall be determined by each governing
13 authority with a minimum requirement that the Ten Commandments shall be
14 displayed on a poster or framed document that is at least eleven inches by fourteen
15 inches. The text of the Ten Commandments shall be the central focus of the poster
16 or framed document and shall be printed in a large, easily readable font.

17 (2) The text shall read as follows:

18 "The Ten Commandments

19 I AM the LORD thy God.

20 Thou shalt have no other gods before me.

21 Thou shalt not make to thyself any graven images.

1 Thou shalt not take the Name of the Lord thy God in vain.

2 Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.

3 Honor thy father and thy mother, that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord

4 thy God giveth thee.

5 Thou shalt not kill.

6 Thou shalt not commit adultery.

7 Thou shalt not steal.

8 Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.

9 Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's house.

10 Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his

11 cattle, nor anything that is thy neighbor's."

12 (3) This Subsection does not require a public school governing authority to
13 spend its funds to purchase displays. A governing authority may spend its funds or
14 donated funds to purchase the displays and may accept donated displays.

15 (4) The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall adopt
16 rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to ensure
17 the proper implementation of this Section.

18 B.(1) Each public postsecondary education management board shall require
19 each institution under its jurisdiction to display the Ten Commandments in each
20 classroom on the institution's campus. At a minimum, the Ten Commandments shall
21 be displayed on a poster or framed document that is at least eleven inches by
22 fourteen inches. The text of the Ten Commandments shall be the central focus of the
23 poster or framed document and shall be printed in a large, easily readable font.

24 (2) The text shall read as provided in Paragraph (A)(2) of this Section.

25 (3) This Subsection does not require a public postsecondary education
26 management board or a public postsecondary education institution to spend its funds
27 to purchase such displays. An institution or management board may spend its funds
28 or donated funds to purchase such displays and may accept donated displays.

1 §3996. Charter schools; exemptions; requirements

2 * * *

3 B. Notwithstanding any state law, rule, or regulation to the contrary and
4 except as may be otherwise specifically provided for in an approved charter, a
5 charter school established and operated in accordance with the provisions of this
6 Chapter and its approved charter and the school's officers and employees shall be
7 exempt from all statutory mandates or other statutory requirements that are
8 applicable to public schools and to public school officers and employees except for
9 the following laws otherwise applicable to public schools with the same grades:

11 (82) Ten Commandments; displays, R.S. 17:2122.

13 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
14 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
15 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
16 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
17 effective on the day following such approval.

Abstract: Requires display of the Ten Commandments in every public elementary, secondary, and postsecondary education classroom

Proposed law requires each public school governing authority to display the Ten Commandments in each building it uses and in each classroom in each school under its jurisdiction.

Proposed law additionally requires such display in every classroom in charter schools and on public postsecondary education institution campuses.

Proposed law authorizes governing authorities, management boards, and institutions to accept donated displays and to spend funds, including donated funds, to purchase displays. Public funds are not required to be used to purchase displays.

Proposed law requires that the Ten Commandments:

- (1) Be displayed on a poster or framed document that is at least 11 inches by 14 inches.
- (2) Be the central focus of the poster or framed document.
- (3) Be printed in a large, easily readable font.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
