Amendments proposed by House Committee on Health and Welfare to Original House Bill
No. 952 by Representative Miller

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 1 delete lines 2 and 5 in their entirety and insert the following:

3 " To amend and reenact R.S. 3:1481(4)(a) and 13, 1482(A) and (B), 1483(C), (E)(1)(a), and
4 (F)(introductory paragraph), 1484(A), (B), and (H), and 1493(B)(9), to enact R.S.
5 3:1482(D)(4), 1483 (B)(8) and (G)(6) and 1485, and to repeal R.S. 3:1481(1) and
6 (11), 1482(E), and 1483(B)(6) and (7), (D), (E)(3), and (F)(1) and (2), relative to
7 consumable hemp products; to provide for the regulation of"

8 AMENDMENT NO. 2

9 On page 1, delete lines 10 and 11 in their entirety and insert the following:

10 "Section 1. R.S. 3:1481(4)(a) and 13, 1482(A) and (B), 1483(C), (E)(1)(a), and
11 (F)(introductory paragraph), 1484(A), (B), and (H), and 1493(B)(9), to enact R.S.
12 3:1482(D)(4) and 1483 (B)(8) and (G)(6) and 1485"

13 AMENDMENT NO. 3

14 On page 1, line 18, after "that contains" delete the remainder of the line

15 AMENDMENT NO. 4

16 On page 2, between lines 17 and 18, insert the following:

17 "(3) A consumable hemp product shall contain only THC compounds
18 naturally derived from industrial hemp or hemp.

19 AMENDMENT NO. 5

20 On page 2, delete lines 22 through 29 in their entirety and insert "(3) Floral hemp material."

21 AMENDMENT NO. 6

22 On page 3, at the beginning of line 1, change "(5)" to "(4)"

23 AMENDMENT NO. 7

24 On page 3, delete lines 8 through 10 in their entirety and insert the following:

25 "(4) On a first conviction or subsequent conviction, the commissioner may
26 revoke the retailer's permit to sell consumable hemp products."

27 AMENDMENT NO. 8

28 On page 3, between lines 14 and 15, insert the following:

29 "B. Any consumable hemp product that is manufactured, distributed,
30 imported, or sold for use in Louisiana shall meet the following criteria:

31 * * *

- (8)(a) A consumable processor shall test the distillate or concentrate used to produce a consumable hemp product. The test shall detect the presence and concentration of THC compounds, solvents, pesticides, microbials, and heavy metals.
- (b) A consumable processor shall conduct a potency test on each batch of product indicating the serving size, total THC compounds per serving, total number of servings, and total THC compounds per package, identified as milligrams per grams.
- (c) A processor shall retain the records of each test for a minimum of three years.

AMENDMENT NO. 9

On page 4, between lines 3 and 4, insert the following:

"E.(1) The application for registration shall include a certificate of analysis containing the following information:

- (a) ~~The batch identification number~~, The name of the product, date received, date of completion, and the method of analysis for each test conducted.

F. The certificate of analysis required by Subsection E of this Section shall be completed by an independent laboratory ~~that meets the following criteria:~~ accredited by the International Organization for Standardization or other accrediting entity approved by the department. A laboratory testing consumable hemp products shall be approved by the Louisiana Department of Health.

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AMENDMENT NO. 10

On page 4, delete lines 8 through 15 in their entirety and insert the following:

"analysis in accordance with Subsection F of this Section. The rules may address aspects of testing including by not limited to all of the following:

- (a) The preference for laboratories in this state.
- (b) The procedure for an on-site facility inspection.
- (c) The requirements and prerequisites for third-party entities that audit independent laboratories for compliance with ISO Standard 17025 or equivalent.

On page 4, delete lines 17 through 19 in their entirety

AMENDMENT NO. 12

On page 7, line 16, after "and (E)(3)," and before "and" insert "(E)(3), and F(1) and (2),"

AMENDMENT NO. 13

On page 7, after line 17, add the following:

"Section 3. This Act shall become effective on January 1, 2025."
