2	To commend Dr. Michelle Yetman for her efforts to improve the lives of those with
3	disabilities and to aid the nonmedical professionals who work with those with
4	disabilities.
5	WHEREAS, allied health professionals make up 60% of all healthcare workers in
6	the US with only .1% of clinical allied health professionals working in academic roles
7	involving teaching and research; and
8	WHEREAS, clinical psychologists play an immeasurable role as allied health
9	professionals as they assess, diagnose, and treat people with various conditions, such as
10	depression, anxiety, trauma, and personality disorders; and
11	WHEREAS, the conditions treated by clinical psychologists are among the most life
12	altering; and
13	WHEREAS, Dr. Michelle Yetman is a clinical psychologist at the School of Allied
14	Health Professions who has gone beyond expectations to improve the lives of those with
15	autistic spectrum disorders through early identification, diagnosis, and promotion of early
16	intervention programs, including assuring ABA therapy is accessible in North Louisiana for
17	patients and their families; ABA therapy is a scientific and evidence-based approach that
18	helps individuals with autism learn and develop skills that will enhance their lives
19	throughout adulthood; and

1 WHEREAS, Dr. Yetman has outstanding experience and educational credentials, 2 which include serving as an Associate Professor and Clinical Psychologist at LSU Health 3 Shreveport, an earned Ph.D. in clinical psychology from Gallaudet University in 2000, an 4 APA-approved clinical internship at the University of Maryland Medical Center, in 5 Baltimore, Maryland, and specialized training in the diagnosis of autistic spectrum disorders 6 at the Center for the Atypical Child at Mount Washington Pediatric Hospital; she is a 7 licensed clinical psychologist who is a member of both the American Psychological 8 Association and the Louisiana Psychological Association; and

9 WHEREAS, Dr. Yetman is especially interested in empowering parents in the 10 diagnostic and evaluation process, engaging collaborative, multi-disciplinary teams for 11 diagnosis and intervention, supporting and educating families and service providers, and 12 offering technical assistance and outreach to community agencies; and

WHEREAS, in addition to making training available to individuals on the autism
spectrum and their families, Dr. Yetman created training for first responders who frequently
deal with individuals on the autism spectrum; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Yetman trained the Shreveport police force on how to interact with individuals with autistic spectrum disorders; she also partnered with the Shreveport police force to establish an opportunity for individuals with autism and other spectrum-related disorders to interact with police in a nonemergency situation in an effort to build trust between individuals with disabilities and first responders; and

WHEREAS, today, Dr. Yetman frequently educates the community through a variety
of media channels on how to access resources for their loved ones with disabilities, as well
as tools to make their lives better.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby commend Dr. Michelle Yetman for her efforts to improve the lives of those with disabilities and to aid the nonmedical professionals who work with those with disabilities and does hereby extend sincerest wishes that she continue to prosper in all of her endeavors.
