# SPECIAL DAY/WEEK/MONTH: Designates May 1, 2024, as St. Bernard Parish Day at the capitol

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To designate Wednesday, May 1, 2024, as St. Bernard Parish Day at the capitol.
3	WHEREAS, St. Bernard Parish lies five miles south of downtown New Orleans,
4	Louisiana, and bestows scenic beauty, cultural treasures, bountiful waterways, and tranquil
5	surroundings to the environs of the southeast region of the state; and
6	WHEREAS, St. Bernard is a community of congenial people who have maintained
7	a unique cultural identity since its founding under Spanish colonial rule; and
8	WHEREAS, Canary Islanders, who identified themselves as "Isleños", immigrated
9	to the lower edge of the parish to join Creole-Acadian pioneers, who settled there in 1720;
10	and
11	WHEREAS, its extraordinary history is commemorated throughout the year as
12	visitors view historically significant sights such as the Chalmette Battlefield at Jean Lafitte
13	National Historic Park and Preserve where, in 1815, a young nation, the United States of
14	America, maintained control of the Mississippi River trade route by the defeat of British
15	forces during the Battle of New Orleans on the plains of Chalmette; and
16	WHEREAS, the historic Malus-Beauregard House, built in the 1830s, is located on
17	the battlefield grounds and is one of the most significant historic structures in the New
18	Orleans area; and
19	WHEREAS, adjacent to the battlefield is the Chalmette National Cemetery
20	established in 1864; its gravesites recall for visitors the various military conflicts throughout
21	American history from the War of 1812 and the Civil War to the Vietnam War; and

1	WHEREAS, the San Bernardo Scenic Byway follows an ancient estuary that was
2	once a main channel of the Mississippi River; this meandering roadway is festooned with
3	grand architectural wonders constructed in the nineteenth century; and
4	WHEREAS, with an abundance of waterways and wetlands, St. Bernard Parish is
5	well known for its fresh seafood and culinary delights that reflect Creole, African, Filipino,
6	and Spanish influences; and
7	WHEREAS, navigable water bodies with access to the Gulf of Mexico, such as Lake
8	Borne, the Mississippi River, and Breton Sound, make St. Bernard a "Sportsman's Paradise"
9	for fishing, hunting, trapping, and birdwatching; and
10	WHEREAS, the impact of this cultural cornucopia is evident in year-round activities
11	and festivals that reflect the heritage of this inviting southern community; and
12	WHEREAS, annual festivities include the Battle of New Orleans Commemoration,
13	the Knights of Nemesis Mardi Gras parade, the Irish, Italian, and Isleños parades, the Los
14	Isleños Festival, the Louisiana Crawfish Festival, the Tomato Festival, the Sugar Festival,
15	the St. Bernard Salutes America Celebration, the Blessing of the Fleet, Trick or Trunk, the
16	Oyster Festival, Fiesta de la Concepcion, All Saints Day Mass and Celebration, Isleños
17	Christmas, the Christmas Tour of Homes, the Community Christmas Concert, and Santa on
18	the Bayou; and
19	WHEREAS, ancient oaks, magnolias, and other fragrant flora align with ageless
20	plantation homes and cemeteries where the past and present meet and come alive; and
21	WHEREAS, in the Old Arabi Historic District, several sites are recognized by the
22	National Register of Historic Places that include the St. Bernard Voice, the weekly
23	community newspaper, dating back to 1870; the Old Jail, completed in 1911; the Maumus
24	Center, the site of the parish's first high school; the Cavaroc House, built in 1839; and
25	Domino Sugar Refinery; and
26	WHEREAS, the people, businesses, and government entities of St. Bernard Parish
27	displayed their resilience in rebuilding their community after its near-total destruction by

Hurricane Katrina on August 29, 2005; and

WHEREAS, the multicultural oasis that is St. Bernard Parish is a medley of
waterways, townships, and historic destinations teeming with a kaleidoscope of attractions
and interesting people that lie nestled in the lush natural beauty of Southeastern Louisiana.
THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
Legislature of Louisiana does hereby designate Wednesday, May 1, 2024, as St. Bernard
Parish Day at the capitol and does hereby acknowledge the many contributions of culture,
beauty, and economic prosperity made to the state by its citizens.
