LEGISLATIVE SESSIONS RE SEE FISC NOTE GF EX See Note Page 1 of 1  
(Constitutional Amendment) Provides for the limited extension of regular sessions for specific purposes

Proposed constitutional amendment provides that if necessary to finally pass a bill appropriating money, the legislature, by a favorable record vote of two-thirds of the elected members of each house, may extend a regular session in increments of two legislative or calendar days. Prohibits the legislature from considering any matter having the effect of law other than a bill appropriating money during such an extension and prohibits a regular session from being extended more than six calendar days beyond the original time and day for the session to adjourn sine die.

**EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

The proposed constitutional amendment may result in increased expenditures of \$154,565 in future fiscal years associated with legislative per diem (6 additional days x \$25,776 daily cost = \$154,565 annual cost) if legislators vote to extend the days in a regular session. There will likely be additional, but indeterminable, costs associated with security, supplies, and travel allowances for every day extended.

The proposed constitutional amendment provides that a regular legislative session can be extended in two day increments, up to six additional days. To the extent that the legislature meets for six additional days, legislators will receive per diem and travel expenses. The current legislative per diem is \$166 and the cost of related benefits (7.65% FICA tax) is approximately \$13 for a daily cost of approximately \$179 or \$25,776 (\$179 X 144 members) per day. The staff of the legislative branch will likely absorb any additional duties required during the extended days with existing staff and resources.

The Department of State may incur minimal ballot processing costs associated with this measure. As a regular practice, the Department of State typically budgets for up to 10 constitutional amendments and statewide propositions for the fall statewide elections. To the extent the ballot includes more than 10 constitutional amendments and statewide propositions, the Department of State may require additional SGF resources for the December 7, 2024, statewide election.
