**KEYWORD AND SUMMARY AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE**

WEAPONS. Prohibits possession of firearms, ammunition, or electric weapons or devices by certain felons. (8/1/24)

**SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL**

1. Adds an exception for a person in the military from the prohibition of possessing a firearm based on certain convictions.

**DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE**

Present law prohibits a person from possessing or carrying a concealed weapon if he has been convicted of, or been found not guilty by reason of insanity for, a crime of violence that is a felony, or certain burglary offenses, or felony illegal uses of weapons, manufacture or possession of a bomb or incendiary device, possession of a firearm during the commission of certain drug offenses, any sex offense, or any crime defined as an attempts to commit one of these offenses, or who has been convicted under the laws of another jurisdiction of a crime that, if committed in La., would be one of these crimes.

Proposed law retains present law and extends the prohibition against possessing a firearm or carrying a concealed weapon to persons that committed a felony-grade delinquent act provided for in present law when that person was 15 or 16 years old and that person is under the age of 22 when the offense is committed.

Proposed law shall not apply to any person who has been accepted into military service as a member of any of the branches of the armed forces of the U.S., the reserve components of the armed forces of the U.S., or the La. National Guard.

Effective August 1, 2024.
