Unless otherwise specified, "licensed audiologist" shall not mean a person who has a provisional or restricted license issued under this Chapter.

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(7)(a) "Practice of audiology" means providing, or offering to provide, to individuals or groups of individuals who have, or are suspected of having, disorders of the auditory system, any service in audiology, including prevention, identification, evaluation, interpretation, counseling, consultation, habilitation, rehabilitation, instruction, supervision, and research. The practice of audiology shall also include

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2	An audiologist may engage in any task, procedure, act, or practice that is necessary
3	including but not limited to any of the following:
4	(i) For the evaluation Evaluation of hearing and the monitoring of neural
5	functioning.
6	(ii) For training Training in the use of amplification, including hearing aids
7	and assistive listening devices.
8	(iii) For the making Making of earmolds.
9	(iv) For the fitting, Fitting, dispensing, and selling of hearing aids.
10	(v) Conducting speech and language screening limited to a pass or fail
11	determination for the purpose of identifying and referring individuals suspected of
12	having disorders of communication.
13	(vi) Managing of cerumen which refers to the removal of wax-like secretions
14	from the cartilaginous portion of the external ear in otherwise healthy ears.

25	aid that meets the United States Food and Drug Administration's requirements for
26	this class of device and which may be dispensed or sold without a hearing

28	engagement, or returned for credit privileges as provided by federal law.
29	(14) "Personal sound amplification product" means an amplification device,
30	as defined by the United States Food and Drug Administration or Federal Trade
31	Commission, that is not labeled as a hearing aid and is not intended to treat hearing
32	<u>loss.</u>
33	(15) "Prescription hearing aid" means a hearing instrument or hearing aid
34	that meets the United States Food and Drug Administration's requirements for this
35	class of device and requires a hearing assessment and prescription prior to purchase
36	and a prescribed fitting and dispensing by a licensed audiologist or hearing
37	instrument professional.
