WHEREAS, the Bayou Blue Assembly has consistently demonstrated a deep commitment to serving the community, engaging in various initiatives including but not limited to:

- (1) Providing vital support and aid to communities affected by natural disasters, partnering with nonprofit organizations such as Christian Aid Ministries, Convoy of Hope, and Terrebonne Churches United Food Bank to deliver essential relief and assistance.
- (2) Contributing to the Churches United Fellowship for over two decades, fostering unity and collaboration among local churches to address community needs and organize
