CRIME: Provides relative to residential contractor fraud.

DIGEST

Present law provides for the crime of residential contractor fraud and provides for penalties.

Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that whoever violates the provisions of <u>present law</u> (R.S. 14:202.1(C)(2), (3), or (4)) and the victim is 60 years of age or older, the offender, in addition to any other penalties imposed pursuant to <u>present law</u>, shall be imprisoned, with or without hard labor, for not more than five years, to be served consecutively with the sentence imposed.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that nothing in <u>present law</u> shall preclude a victim from pursuing civil remedies pursuant to <u>present law</u> (R.S. 9:4856) or any other applicable provision of law.

(Amends R.S. 14:202.1(D); adds R.S. 14:202.1(E) and (F))

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Make technical changes.
- 2. Provide that <u>proposed law</u> applies to an offender who violates the felony provisions of <u>present law</u> and the victim is 60, <u>rather than</u> 65, years of age or older.
- 3. Clarify that either the age of the victim or the offender's conduct can serve as a basis for prosecution under proposed law.
- 4. Define the term "emotional or mental suffering".

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary C to the reengrossed bill

- 1. Delete "emotional or mental suffering" from consideration for enhanced sentencing.
- 2. Delete the definition of "emotional or mental suffering".
