<u>Proposed law</u> allows the commissioner to enter into an agreement with public or private persons or agencies to be digital transaction providers who can provide and renew digital credentials and provides a contract can be denied if the person or organization has violated any rule or regulation of the office of motor vehicles. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that digital transaction providers may collect registration license taxes and fees and may collect a convenience charge as provided in present law <u>Proposed law</u> provides that the digital transaction provider must execute a surety bond of \$100,000 naming the Dept. of <u>Public Safety and Corrections</u>, office of motor vehicles, as obligee. Further provides the surety bond must be delivered to the Dept. of <u>Public Safety and Corrections</u>, office of motor vehicles. <u>Proposed law</u> requires the digital transaction provider to acquire a cyber liability insurance policy for \$1,000,000 that names the state of La., the Dept. of <u>Public Safety and Corrections</u>, office of motor vehicles, department employees, and the office of technology services and its employees as additional insureds.
