STUDENT/DISCIPLINE: Prohibits certain types of discipline of students in elementary and secondary schools

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

1. Make technical change.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law</u> defines corporal punishment as the use of physical force that causes pain or discomfort to discipline a student, not including seclusion or restraint under certain circumstances.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits the use of any form of corporal punishment for students in elementary and secondary schools unless a parent or legal guardian provides written consent for the use of corporal punishment.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits taping a student's mouth shut or restricting a student's airway as forms of student discipline, regardless of parental consent for the use of corporal punishment.

<u>Present law</u> is applicable to charter schools and nonpublic schools that receive state funds. Proposed law also applies to such schools.
