5	relative to offenses against minors; to provide for the Child Abuse and Negleco
6	Registry; to provide for registration requirements; to provide for duration of
7	registration; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 15:563(A)(4), (B), the introductory paragraph of (C)(1), and (C)(2)
10	and 563.2 as enacted by Act No. 460 of the 2023 Regular Session are hereby amended and
11	reenacted to read as follows:
12	§563. Registration of persons convicted of child abuse or neglect
13	A. Any person residing in this state who has pled guilty or nolo contendered
14	to, or has been convicted of, any of the following felony offenses, or who has pled
15	guilty or nolo contendere to, or has been convicted of any conspiracy to commit any
16	of the following felony offenses, where the victim is a minor, as defined in
17	Children's Code Article 116, may be required to register and provide notification as
18	a child abuser in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter:
19	* * *
20	(4) R.S. 14:35.3(K), (L), (M), (N), (O), or (P) (Domestic abuse battery)

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2	B.(1) Upon conviction, the court shall provide written notification to any
3	person convicted of an offense listed in Subsection A of this Section when the victim
4	is a minor that and when he shall be required to register on the Child Abuse and
5	Neglect Registry upon release, or as a condition of his probation or parole.
6	(2) An offender listed in Subsection A of this Section who is required to
7	<u>register</u> shall register in person with the sheriff of the parish of the person's
8	residence, or residences, if there is more than one, and with the chief of police if the
9	address of any of the person's residences is located in an incorporated area which has
10	a police department. If the offender resides in a municipality with a population in
11	excess of three hundred thousand persons, he shall register in person with the police
12	department of his municipality of residence.
13	C.(1) No later than three business days after release, the offender who is
14	<u>required to register</u> shall register and provide all of the following information to the
15	appropriate law enforcement agencies listed in Subsection B of this Section:
16	* * *
17	(2)(a)(i) Failure to register as required in Paragraph (1) of this
18	Subsection shall constitute a violation of this Chapter.
19	(ii) Knowingly providing false information to any law enforcement officer,
20	office, or agency required to receive registration information pursuant to the
21	provisions of this Chapter shall constitute a failure to register and, upon .
22	(b) Upon conviction, the offender shall be fined not more than one thousand
23	dollars and be imprisoned for not more than one year with or without hard labor.

25	§563.2. Duration of registration and notification period
26	A person required to register pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter shall
27	comply with the requirement and keep current his registration information for ten
28	years from the date of initial registration in Louisiana for a first offense and for the
29	duration of the lifetime of the offender for a second or subsequent offense, unless the
30	underlying conviction is reversed, set aside, or vacated.
