A RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, after retiring from international employment, Frank began work as a consultant with Marine Well Containment Company in Texas; he was serving as a senior field superintendent at the time of his passing; and

WHEREAS, outside of his work as an engineer, Mr. Johnson owned a successful commercial mail receiving business which he operated with his mother for fifteen years; while at home, he loved to entertain friends and family, and he hosted numerous family
