A RESOLUTION

To commend Andrew Cockrell on achieving the rank of Eagle Scout.

WHEREAS, it is most fitting to commend and celebrate the accomplishments of Andrew Cockrell of Boy Scouts of America Norwela Troop 10 on the memorable and historic occasion of his attainment of the prestigious rank of Eagle Scout, which will be presented to him during the Eagle Scout court of honor on May 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Boy Scouts of America, founded on February 8, 1910, and chartered by the United States Congress in 1916, is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetime by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law; and

WHEREAS, to earn the rank of Eagle Scout, the highest rank in Scouting, a Boy Scout must fulfill all requirements of leadership, services, and outdoor skills and must earn twenty-one merit badges which signify the mastery of Scouting skills, including Citizenship in the Community, Citizenship in the Nation, and Citizenship in the World; Andrew has earned more than forty merit badges; and

WHEREAS, Andrew faithfully embodies the twelve points of the Scout Law: he is trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean, and reverent; and

WHEREAS, in pursuit of the rank of Eagle Scout, Andrew directed his troop in constructing a twenty-foot long wooden bridge over a difficult section of trail in the Kisatchie National Forest near Minden; and

WHEREAS, presented with his Eagle Scout badge, Andrew Cockrell joins the ranks of such esteemed and respected Eagle Scouts as the Honorable Gerald R. Ford, the thirty-eighth president of the United States; Captain James Lovell, the commander of the Apollo 13 space flight; Neil Armstrong, the first man to walk on the moon; acclaimed filmmaker Steven Spielberg; and Bill Gates, the founder of Microsoft; and WHEREAS, the legacy for the Boy Scouts is indeed a rich one, for it not only includes a history of service of proud citizenship which spans more than a century, but it also includes the history of service and singular accomplishments of Andrew Cockrell, a young man to be recognized and commended by future Eagle Scouts and his community for the deep human values and genuine spirit of good fellowship that he inspires.
