Abstract: Provides relative to preventing restaurant reservation fraud.

Proposed law defines "food service establishment" and "third-party restaurant reservation platform".

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for what a third-party restaurant reservation platform shall not do unless there is a written agreement between that third-party restaurant reservation platform and the food service establishment authorizing it to do so.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the attorney general may impose a civil penalty not to exceed \$1000 for each violation of <u>proposed law</u>. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that civil penalties collected under <u>proposed</u> <u>law</u> shall be used to promote consumer protection and education.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the attorney general may seek restitution to a person who purchased a reservation outlined in <u>proposed law</u>.
