JUVENILES. Provides for the governance of the Juvenile Justice District and adds Lafourche Parish to the Juvenile Justice District. (8/1/25)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 15:1109.11, 1109.12(A), 1109.13, 1109.16(A), and 1109.17,
3	relative to the River Parishes Juvenile Justice District; to provide relative to the
4	jurisdiction of the River Parishes Juvenile Justice District; to provide relative to the
5	addition of Lafourche Parish to the district; to provide relative to the board of
6	commissioners of the district; to provide relative to the composition, administration
7	and domicile of the board; and to provide for related matters.
8	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. R.S. 15:1109.11, 1109.12(A), 1109.13, 1109.16(A), and 1109.17 are
11	hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
12	§1109.11. River Parishes Juvenile Justice District; creation; jurisdiction
13	The River Parishes Juvenile Justice District is hereby established as a
14	political subdivision of the state, with a territorial jurisdiction throughout the
15	Seventeenth, Twenty-Third, Twenty-Ninth, and Fortieth Judicial Districts, including
16	the parishes of Ascension, Assumption, Lafourche, St. Charles, St. James, and St.
17	John the Baptist.

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2	A. The River Parishes Juvenile Justice Commission is hereby created to
3	control, administer, and manage the affairs of the district. The commission shall be
4	composed of a board of fourteen commissioners, who shall be qualified electors
5	domiciled and residing in the district. Five Three commissioners shall be jointly
6	appointed, for terms of four years, by the sheriffs of the Twenty-Third Judicial
7	District; one commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the
8	sheriff of Lafourche Parish, two commissioners one commissioner shall be
9	appointed, for terms a term of four years, by the sheriff of St. Charles Parish; one
10	commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the sheriff of St. John
11	the Baptist Parish; one commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years,
12	by the district attorney of the Seventeenth Judicial District; one commissioner
13	shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the district attorney of the Twenty-
14	Third Judicial District; one commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four
15	years, by the district attorney of the Twenty-Ninth Judicial District; one
16	commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the district attorney of
17	the Fortieth Judicial District; one commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of
18	four years, by the chief judge of the Seventeenth Judicial District; one
19	commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the chief judge of the
20	Twenty-Third Judicial District; one commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of
21	four years, by the chief judge of the Twenty-Ninth Judicial District; and one
22	commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the chief judge of the
23	Fortieth Judicial District. All appointments shall be confirmed by the Senate.

25	§1109.13. Purpose

§1109.12. Board of commissioners; appointment; terms

The purpose of the commission shall be to assist and afford opportunities to 26 children who enter the juvenile justice system, or who are children in need of care 27 28 or supervision, to become productive, law-abiding citizens of the community, parish, 29 and state by the establishment of rehabilitative programs within a structured

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environment and to provide physical facilities and related services for children

throughout the parishes of Ascension, Assumption, Lafourche, St. Charles, St. James, and St. John the Baptist.

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§1109.16. Board; domicile; power to levy taxes, incur debt, and issue bonds

A. The board of commissioners shall be domiciled in the parish of St. James 6 7 Lafourche and shall have the power to sue and be sued. In the exercise of its powers 8 to control, administer, and manage the affairs of the district, the board may incur 9 debt and issue bonds and may levy taxes in the manner provided in this Subpart and 10 pursuant to Article VI, Sections 30 and 32 of the Constitution of Louisiana or any 11 other constitutional or statutory authority. The board generally may perform any 12 function and exercise any power necessary, requisite, or proper for the administration 13 and management of the affairs of the commission and, specifically, may cooperate with juvenile courts and other courts and public agencies within the Seventeenth, 14 Twenty-Third, Twenty-Ninth, and Fortieth Judicial Districts to aid and assist in all 15 16 ways authorized by law for the purposes and responsibilities for which the commission is established. 17

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§1109.17. Funding for the commission; criminal court costs

20 A. In the parishes of Ascension, Assumption, Lafourche, St. Charles, St. James, and St. John the Baptist, in all felony and misdemeanor prosecutions, 21 including traffic offenses, under state law or parish or municipal ordinance, in any 22 district, parish, city, or mayor's court, special costs in an amount not to exceed five 23 dollars shall be levied against every defendant who is convicted after trial, enters a 24 plea of guilty or nolo contendere, or forfeits bond. However, in lieu of imposing the 25 special costs, the court may direct that a like amount be deducted from any fine 26 27 imposed prior to disposition of the fine in accordance with other laws, but in either event any amounts so collected shall be remitted, by the tenth of the month following 28 29 the month in which collected, by the proper officer of the court to the board of the

2	operations as provided in this Subpart.
3	B. In the parishes of Ascension, Assumption, Lafourche, St. Charles, St.
4	James, and St. John the Baptist, in all courts exercising juvenile jurisdiction, special
5	costs in an amount not to exceed five dollars shall be levied against every juvenile
6	who is found to have committed a traffic violation, under state law or parish or
7	municipal ordinance, and special costs in an amount not to exceed twenty-five
8	dollars shall be levied against every juvenile who is adjudicated a delinquent. All or
9	part of the costs may be suspended, but any amounts collected shall be remitted, by
10	the tenth of the month following the month in which collected, by the proper officer
11	of the court in which the matter was heard to the board of the River Parishes Juvenile
12	Justice Commission to be used for the expenses of its operations pursuant to this
13	Subpart.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 15:1109) provides that the River Parishes Juvenile Justice District is hereby established as a political subdivision of the state, with a territorial jurisdiction throughout the 23rd, 29th, and 40th Judicial Districts, including the parishes of Ascension, Assumption, St. Charles, St. James, and St. John the Baptist.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and includes Lafourche Parish in the River Parishes Juvenile Justice District.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the commission shall be composed of a board of 14 commissioners.

Proposed law retains present law.

Present law provides that the board of commissioners shall be composed as follows:

- (1) Five commissioners shall be jointly appointed, for terms of four years, by the sheriffs of the 23rd Judicial District.
- (2) Two commissioners shall be appointed, for terms of four years, by the sheriff of St. Charles Parish.
- (3) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the sheriff of St. John the Baptist Parish.

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- (4) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the district attorney of the 23rd JDC.
- (5) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the district attorney of the 29th JDC.
- (6) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the district attorney of the 40th JDC.
- (7) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the chief judge of the 23rd JDC.
- (8) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the chief judge of the 29th JDC.
- (9) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the chief judge of the 40th JDC.

Proposed law changes present law composition of the board of commissioners as follows:

- (1) Three commissioners shall be jointly appointed, for terms of four years, by the sheriffs of the 23rd JDC.
- (2) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the sheriff of Lafourche Parish.
- (3) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the sheriff of St. Charles Parish.
- (4) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the sheriff of St. John the Baptist Parish.
- (5) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the district attorney of the 17th JDC.
- (6) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the district attorney of the 23rd JDC.
- (7) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the district attorney of the 29th JDC.
- (8) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the district attorney of the 40th JDC.
- (9) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the chief judge of the 17th JDC.
- (10) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the chief judge of the 23rd JDC.
- (11) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the chief judge of the 29th JDC.
- (12) One commissioner shall be appointed, for a term of four years, by the chief judge of the 40th JDC.

Present law provides that all commissioner appointments shall be confirmed by the Senate.

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Proposed law retains present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the board of commissioners shall be domiciled in the parish of St. James.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes <u>present law</u> to provide that the board of commissioners shall be domiciled in Lafourche Parish.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the board generally may perform any function and exercise any power necessary, requisite, or proper for the administration and management of the affairs of the commission and, specifically, may cooperate with juvenile courts and other courts and public agencies within the 23rd, 29th, and 40th judicial districts to aid and assist in all ways authorized by law for the purposes and responsibilities for which the commission is established.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds juvenile courts and other courts and public agencies within the 17th JDC as entities that may aid and assist the district in all ways authorized by law for the purposes and responsibilities for which the commission is established.

<u>Present law</u> provides that in the parishes of Ascension, Assumption, St. Charles, St. James, and St. John the Baptist, in all felony and misdemeanor prosecutions, including traffic offenses, under state law or parish or municipal ordinance, in any district, parish, city, or mayor's court, special costs in an amount not to exceed five dollars, shall be levied against every defendant who is convicted after trial, enters a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, or forfeits bond.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further provides that any district, parish, city, or mayor's court in Lafourche Parish to the parishes that may levee a fine not to exceed five dollars to every defendant who is convicted after trial, enters a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, or forfeits bond

<u>Present law</u> provides that in the parishes of Ascension, Assumption, St. Charles, St. James, and St. John the Baptist, in all courts exercising juvenile jurisdiction, special costs in an amount not to exceed five dollars shall be levied against every juvenile who is found to have committed a traffic violation, under state law or parish or municipal ordinance, and special costs in an amount not to exceed \$25 shall be levied against every juvenile who is adjudicated a delinquent.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further provides that all courts exercising juvenile jurisdiction in Lafourche Parish to the parishes that may levee against every juvenile who is found to have committed a traffic violation, under state law or parish or municipal ordinance, and special costs in an amount not to exceed \$25 against every juvenile who is adjudicated a delinquent.

Effective August 1, 2025.
