HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 276

BY REPRESENTATIVE FREIBERG

EARLY CHILDHOOD: Requests the legislative auditor to perform an audit or evaluation of services and supports provided to recipients of financial assistance through the Child Care Assistance Program

A RESOLUTION

2 To urge and request the legislative auditor to perform an audit or evaluation of services and 3 supports provided to recipients of financial assistance through the Child Care 4 Assistance Program (CCAP) and publish a report of findings and recommendations. 5 WHEREAS, to help support families in accessing high quality child care, CCAP 6 provides financial assistance to low-income families in which parents and legal guardians 7 work or attend school; elected officials in Louisiana have long prioritized CCAP for the 8 safety, well-being, development, and early learning of children, transferring administration 9 of the program from the Louisiana Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) to 10 the state Department of Education (DOE) in 2016; and 11 WHEREAS, under DOE and the State Board of Elementary and Secondary 12 Education (BESE), standards for child safety have been strengthened and early learning 13 opportunities have improved; and 14 WHEREAS, for many recipients, CCAP is not the only form of government 15 assistance that they receive; for example, many also receive Supplemental Nutrition 16 Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits; there is a need for CCAP recipients to receive 17 supportive services to help empower them and their families to effectively transition from 18 poverty and dependence to security, self-sufficiency, and independence; such services are 19 not available through DOE; and

1	WHEREAS, House Resolution No. 100 of the 2023 Regular Session of the
2	Legislature urged and requested the legislative auditor to conduct an appropriate audit or
3	evaluation of assistance programs in this state to evaluate participation, costs, and outcomes
4	for each program and identify areas for improved coordination, including CCAP, SNAP, the
5	Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Employment and Training initiative, the
6	Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
7	program, the unemployment insurance program, and any other block grant and assistance
8	programs the legislative auditor deemed necessary to include; and
9	WHEREAS, in February 2024, the legislative auditor published an informational
10	report titled, "Coordination of Public Assistance and Workforce Development Programs";
11	the auditor reported that, in Fiscal Year 2023, total payments to child care providers equaled
12	one hundred eighty-eight million dollars of federal and state funds; and
13	WHEREAS, it is unknown what level of services, if any, the parents and legal
14	guardians who receive CCAP are receiving relative to finding suitable employment and
15	making progress toward self-sufficiency, which would benefit them, their children, and
16	Louisiana's workforce and economy; and
17	WHEREAS, the legislative auditor's report noted the need for "more collaboration
18	among agencies and stakeholders to put together a unified vision and plan detailing how best
19	to coordinate and administer public assistance and workforce development programs"; and
20	WHEREAS, on March 22, 2024, Governor Landry established, through Executive
21	Order No. JML 24-44, the Louisiana Workforce and Social Services (LA WASS) Reform
22	Task Force; its duties included to "conduct research and collect data on state models for
23	coordinating and fully integrating workforce, social services, education, child care, and
24	healthcare programs and develop alternative approaches that Louisiana should consider to
25	achieve improved outcomes;" and
26	WHEREAS, the secretaries of DCFS and the Louisiana Workforce Commission
27	(LWC) submitted the LA WASS Reform Task Force's report on January 31, 2025, to the
28	governor, speaker of the House, and president of the Senate; the governor, his cabinet, and
29	members of the legislature have been diligently working with task force members and
30	stakeholders to develop a plan to improve the efficacy of social services through the

1 integration of such programs and improved service delivery focused on supporting

- 2 individuals to effectively transition them out of poverty; and
- WHEREAS, legislation was introduced in the 2025 Regular Session as House Bill
- 4 Nos. 617 and 624 to implement the task force's recommendations and make significant
- 5 progress toward the vision of an effective "One Door" model to benefit Louisianans in need
- 6 and to boost the state's workforce and economy.
- 7 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
- 8 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the legislative auditor to perform an
- 9 audit or evaluation of services and supports provided to recipients of financial assistance
- 10 through CCAP and publish a report of findings and recommendations no later than
- 11 March 12, 2027.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the audit or evaluation shall reflect the state's
- progress relative to the potential passage of House Bill Nos. 617 and 624.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
- 15 legislative auditor, the governor, the state superintendent of education, the president of
- 16 BESE, and the secretaries of DCFS and LWC.
