KEYWORD AND SUMMARY AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

DISCRIMINATION. Provides relative to discrimination based on military status in education, employment, public accommodations and housing options. (8/1/25)

SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

1. Make technical changes.
2. Makes it unlawful for any person or other entity to discriminate against any person because of military status.
3. Makes it unlawful to deny any person access to any multiple-listing service, real estate brokers' organization or other service, organization, or facility, or to discriminate against him in the terms or conditions of such access, membership, or participation on account of military status.

DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

Present law prohibits discrimination in public schools on account of race, creed, color, disability, national origin, or natural, protective, or cultural hairstyle.

Proposed law adds military status to the list provided in present law.

Present law prohibits discrimination in employment on account of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or natural, protective, or cultural hairstyle.

Proposed law adds military status to the list provided in present law.

Present law prohibits discrimination in public buildings on account of race, color, creed, or physical or mental disability.

Proposed law adds military status to the list provided in present law.

Present law prohibits discrimination in facilities to which the public is invited on account of race, religion, or national ancestry and from arbitrary, capricious, or unreasonable discrimination based on age, sex, or physical or mental disability.

Proposed law adds military status to the list provided in present law.

Present law prohibits discrimination in the sale or rental of housing on account of race, color, religion, sex, familial status, national origin, or natural, protective, or cultural hairstyle.

Proposed law adds military status to the list provided in present law.

Proposed law defines "military status".

Effective August 1, 2025.
