A RESOLUTION

To commend Alexandra Gramby on being named Louisiana's first national Miss Juneteenth.

WHEREAS, Alexandra Gramby is an eighteen-year-old resident of Maurice, Louisiana, and 2025 graduate of North Vermilion High School; she is the daughter of Frankie and Stacie Brooks, and her maternal grandfather, former Lafayette attorney David Dennis, is a prominent civil rights activist who rose to the global stage during the 1960s and served as the Mississippi director of the Congress of Racial Equality; and

WHEREAS, Alexandra is the first Louisiana Miss Juneteenth Queen to win the National Miss Juneteenth Queen title, and she has earned national recognition while touring the country as a goodwill ambassador; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Gramby also joined the regional Juneteenth Committee, the Greater SWLA Black Chamber of Commerce, and others to host an African American history program for youth across the eight-parish region; and

WHEREAS, Alexandra Gramby plans to attend the University of Louisiana at Lafayette, where she will study nursing; she is truly deserving of the highest recognition for her incredible achievements, which have brought immense pride to the state.
