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Provides relative to expedited partner therapy

Present law allows licensed physicians, advanced practice registered nurses, or physician assistants to prescribe medications to treat the sexual partners of patients being treated for gonorrhea or chlamydia without examination, known as expedited partner therapy.

Proposed law retains present law and adds trichomoniasis, or other sexually associated infection, as determined by the Louisiana Department of Health (LDH). Proposed law adds that a physician, advanced practice nurse, or physician assistant who reasonably and in good faith renders expedited partner therapy and a pharmacist who reasonably and in good faith dispenses drugs in accordance this measure shall not be subject to civil or criminal liability or be deemed to have engaged in unprofessional conduct. Proposed law requires LDH to create a list of sexually associated infections that are eligible for expedited partner therapy.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. LDH indicates that any administrative activities associated with the development and maintenance of a list of sexually associated infections eligible for expedited partner therapy, and any associated rulemaking activities, can be absorbed within existing staff and resources.

Proposed law does not mandate treatment and only expands the scope of infections for which healthcare providers may prescribe expedited partner therapy.
