PESTICIDES/HERBICIDES: Provides for the enforcement procedures of the Structural  
Pest Control Commission

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 3:3372(E)(2), relative to the enforcement procedures of the  
3 Structural Pest Control Commission; to provide relative to notice requirements  
4 applicable to an adjudicatory hearing held by the commission; and to provide for  
5 related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 3:3372(E)(2) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

8 §3372. Enforcement

9 \* \* \*

10 E. Civil penalties may be assessed, probation may be imposed, and permits,  
11 licenses, and registrations may be suspended or revoked only by a ruling of the  
12 commission based on an adjudicatory hearing held in accordance with the  
13 Administrative Procedure Act and the following special provisions:

14 \* \* \*

15 (2) The commission shall notify the alleged violator ~~by certified mail at least~~  
16 ~~thirty days prior to the date the hearing is held~~ in accordance with the provisions of  
17 the Administrative Procedure Act.

**Abstract:** Revises the time period for providing notice of an adjudicatory hearing of the Structural Pest Control Commission.

Present law authorizes the commission to impose civil penalties, probation, and suspend or revoke permits, licenses, and registrations based on an adjudicatory hearing conducted in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act (APA). Further requires the commission to provide the alleged violator with at least 30 days of notice of an adjudicatory hearing by certified mail.

Proposed law modifies present law by requiring a hearing notice be provided in accordance with the APA instead of requiring a minimum 30-day notice period.
