Abstract: Provides relative to interactive computer services that contract with minors and the display of material harmful to minors.

Proposed law defines "account", "interactive computer service", "minor", and "material harmful to minors".

Proposed law prohibits an interactive computer service that enters into a contract with a minor from delivering or displaying to a minor account material harmful to minors that was created or developed, in whole or in part, by the interactive computer service.

Proposed law subjects any interactive computer service that violates the provisions of proposed law to a civil fine of up to \$10,000 per violation set and enforced by the attorney general by filing a civil enforcement action in a court of competent jurisdiction.

Proposed law provides that if a court of competent jurisdiction grants judgment or injunctive relief to the attorney general, the court shall award the attorney general reasonable attorney fees, court costs, and investigative costs.

Effective Jan. 1, 2027.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Civil Law and Procedure to the original bill:

1. Make technical changes.
2. Specify that an interactive computer service is prohibited from delivering to a minor account any material harmful to minors created by the interactive computer service.
3. Remove the restrictions on the algorithm used by an interactive computer service.
4. Remove the penalty provisions which would have allowed an interactive computer service to cure a violation of proposed law.
