Abstract: Requires hazardous liquid pipeline operators to include emergency contact information on required signage and line markers and to certify at least every twelve months to the secretary of the Department of Conservation and Energy that the contact information on signs and line markers is correct and manned at all times.

Present law authorizes the secretary of the Dept. of Conservation and Energy to regulate hazardous liquid pipelines within the state.

Proposed law retains present law.

Present law requires that hazardous liquid pipeline operators install certain signs and line markers at specified locations.

Proposed law retains present law.

Proposed law requires that operators of hazardous liquid pipelines include emergency contact phone numbers on the signs and line markers that they are required to install under present law.

Proposed law requires operators to certify to the secretary at least every 12 months that the contact information is current and that the phone number provided will be answered at all times.

Proposed law prohibits the secretary from authorizing a waiver of proposed law pursuant to a waiver process authorized under present law.

Proposed law provides that a violation of proposed law will subject operators to penalties provided under present law.
