1 AN ACT  
2 To amend and reenact R.S. 38:5.1(A), 20(A) and (B), 84(A) and (B), 2351(A) and (B), 2352,  
3 2353(B), 2354(A)(1), (B)(1) and (4), (D)(1), and (E)(1), 2355(A)(1) through (4),  
4 (B)(6) and (10), and (C), the introductory paragraph of 2356(A), 2356(A)(2), and  
5 (B)(2) and (5), and (C), 2358, 2359(B), (D)(2), and (E)(1)(a), and 2360(C) and to  
6 repeal R.S. 38:2353(D), relative to public works; to provide for realigning of  
7 agencies and responsibilities; to provide for the technical changes relative to the  
8 Department of Transportation and Development's members of the authority; to  
9 provide for Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority; and to provide for related  
10 matters.

11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

12 Section 1. R.S. 38:5.1(A), 20(A) and (B), 84(A) and (B), 2351(A) and (B), 2352,  
13 2353(B), 2354(A)(1), (B)(1) and (4), (D)(1), and (E)(1), 2355(A)(1) through (4), (B)(6) and  
14 (10), and (C), the introductory paragraph of 2356(A), 2356(A)(2), and (B)(2) and (5), and  
15 (C), 2358, 2359(B), (D)(2), and (E)(1)(a), and 2360(C) are hereby amended and reenacted  
16 to read as follows:

17 §5.1. Planning assistance to municipal and other planning agencies; federal grants

§84. Parishes and municipalities authorized to comply with federal flood insurance act

A. In order to secure for the citizens of the state of Louisiana the flood insurance coverage provided for by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, 42 U.S.C. 4001 et seq., all of the parishes and municipalities of the state may adopt, in coordination with the ~~chief resilience officer~~ such **Department of Transportation and Development** ordinances, rules, and regulations, including zoning and land use regulations, as ~~are~~ necessary to comply with the requirements of ~~said~~ **the** Act and the regulations adopted ~~pursuant thereto~~ by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. For ~~upland~~ **noncoastal** areas of the state as defined in R.S. 38:2352, said ordinances, rules, and regulations shall also comply with any statewide floodplain management standards which may be established by the Coordinated Use of Resources for Recreation, Economy, Navigation, and Transportation Authority.

B. The ~~chief resilience officer~~ **Department of Transportation and Development** shall cooperate with the Federal Insurance Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency in the planning and carrying out of state participation in the National Flood Insurance Program and shall aid, advise, and cooperate with parishes and municipalities endeavoring to qualify for participation in said program.

§2351. Coordinated Use of Resources for Recreation, Economy, Navigation, and Transportation Authority; purpose and intent

A. The Coordinated Use of Resources for Recreation, Economy, Navigation, and Transportation Authority, referred to in this Chapter as the "authority", is hereby established as the single coordinating entity responsible for the prioritization, planning, and funding of projects related to flood control, **flood** risk reduction, navigation, and ~~water resource~~ **floodplain and watershed** management in all areas of the state not included within the coastal area as defined in R.S. 49:214.2.

1 A. The board shall:

2 (1) Represent the state's position on policy relative to the protection,  
3 conservation, enhancement, and management of the ~~upland~~ **noncoastal** area of the  
4 state through oversight of integrated projects and programs and by addressing  
5 activities which could significantly affect integrated projects and programs, all  
6 consistent with the legislative intent as expressed in this Title.

7 (2) Develop, coordinate, make reports on, and provide oversight for a  
8 comprehensive ~~upland~~ **noncoastal** area master plan and annual plans, working in  
9 conjunction with state agencies, political subdivisions, including flood protection  
10 authorities, levee districts, and federal agencies. The master plan shall include a  
11 comprehensive strategy addressing the protection, conservation, enhancement, and  
12 management of the upland area through the construction and management of  
13 integrated projects and programs, all consistent with the legislative intent as  
14 expressed in this Chapter. The annual plan shall be developed as the annual  
15 implementation of the comprehensive master plan and shall be submitted to the  
16 legislature for approval as set forth in R.S. 38:2354. The annual plan shall include  
17 a description and status of all projects and programs pertaining to the authority's  
18 mission, including privately funded projects or plans, and addressing those activities  
19 which significantly affect projects set forth in the plan, all consistent with the  
20 legislative intent as expressed in this Title.

21 (3) Submit to the ~~House Committee on Natural Resources and Environment~~  
22 ~~and the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and the~~ House Committee on  
23 Transportation, Highways and Public Works and the Senate Committee on  
24 Transportation, Highways and Public Works the integrated plans developed pursuant  
25 to R.S. 38:2354. Upon approval of the plans by the legislative committees and prior  
26 to implementation of the plans, in whole or in part, the plans shall be approved by  
27 the legislature as provided in R.S. 38:2354(E).

28 (4) Develop procedures in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act  
29 and take actions against any entity, including political subdivisions, to enforce

1 compliance with the comprehensive master ~~upland~~ **noncoastal** area plan. Such  
2 procedures and actions may include but are not limited to determinations of  
3 noncompliance; appeal from such determinations; the taking of administrative  
4 action, including the withholding of funds; and civil action, including the seeking of  
5 injunctive relief, or any other remedy necessary to ensure compliance with the plan.

9 (6) Approve all requests for programs and projects in the ~~upland~~ **noncoastal**  
10 area, insofar as such requests are for funds to be appropriated from the funds  
11 available to the authority.

13 (10) Enter into any agreement with a parish governing authority located  
14 wholly or partially within the coastal area but which is not part of a levee district for  
15 the construction, operation, maintenance, repair, rehabilitation, or replacement of any  
16 ~~upland~~ **noncoastal** protection, conservation and restoration, hurricane protection,  
17 infrastructure, storm damage reduction, integrated coastal protection, or flood control  
18 project. The board shall have the power to provide in the agreement for the use and  
19 exercise by the parish governing authority of all powers of levee districts or levee  
20 and drainage districts.

21 C. Approval by the board shall be required for any request by a state agency  
22 or department for any funds to finance research, programs, mitigation, or projects  
23 involving integrated protection, including hurricane protection or the conservation  
24 and restoration, of ~~upland~~ **noncoastal** areas. However, this Subsection shall not  
25 affect self-generated or dedicated funds.

27 §2356. Coordinated Use of Resources for Recreation, Economy, Navigation, and  
28 Transportation Authority

29 A. The Coordinated Use of Resources for Recreation, Economy, Navigation,

 4 extent practicable.

6 §2358. Interaction with Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority

7 The Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority and the Coordinated Use  
 8 of Resources for Recreation, Economy, Navigation, and Transportation Authority  
 9 shall jointly develop integrated flood protection strategies. The Coastal Protection  
 10 and Restoration Authority shall remain responsible for its functions and  
 11 responsibilities as defined in R.S. 49:214.5.1 et seq. The Coordinated Use of  
 12 Resources for Recreation, Economy, Navigation, and Transportation Authority shall  
 13 oversee riverine flood management, inland navigation, and ~~water resource~~ **flood**

 23 38:2354, regardless of the source of funds for the project, except in cases of projects  
 24 undertaken and financed out of the emergency fund, established in the annual plan.  
 25 An emergency for which such fund shall be used shall be defined by the Coordinated  
 26 Use of Resources for Recreation, Economy, Navigation, and Transportation  
 27 Authority Board and all funds shall be spent only in accord with procedures  
 28 established by the authority board for such fund. All projects undertaken pursuant

 2 authority, including but not limited to direct federal aid, grants, gifts, and other

7 (2) Acquire by purchase, donation, or otherwise any land rights needed for

 10 subdivision of the state; provided, that any property acquired for any project may  
 11 reserve the minerals to the landowners, whether private or public, in accordance with  
 12 the provisions of R.S. 31:149.

14 E.(1) The board or the authority shall be authorized to solely utilize the  
 15 science and technology capacity of Louisiana universities, the water institute, and  
 16 other institutes within the state to enhance programs, projects, and activities for the

 19 biological, or cultural baseline conditions in the ~~upland~~ **noncoastal** area.

21 §2360. Infrastructure priority program; applications; evaluations

23 C. The applications submitted by agencies shall be evaluated by the board  
 24 which shall hold no less than three public hearings in separate locations within the  
 25 ~~upland~~ **noncoastal** area for the purpose of receiving public testimony and comment  
 26 from requesting authorities and citizens regarding the proposed infrastructure  
 27 projects. Such hearings may be held at the same time and location as hearings set for  
 28 public comment on the annual plan. The authority shall prioritize and rank such  
 29 applications. The authority shall provide its application evaluations to the board.

Present law provides the Department of Public Works, state of Louisiana provides planning assistance to municipal, parish, regional and other planning agencies of the state and is authorized to apply for and accept grants of money from the U.S. government or any federal agencies and may contract with them as necessary to accept the grant and any requirements for matching the grants. Proposed law retains present law and changes the agency from the Department of Public Works, state of Louisiana to the Department of Transportation and Development (DOTD).

Proposed law provides the secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development will be a member appointed to the Red River Compact Commission. Proposed law changes the member from the chief engineer of the office of engineering to the secretary of the Department of Transportation and Development.

Present law provides parishes and municipalities authorized to comply with federal flood insurance may adopt, ordinances, rules, and regulations, including zoning and land use regulations, necessary to comply with the requirements of the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 in coordination with the chief resilience officer of DOTD. Proposed law retains present law and removes the chief resilience officer designee.

Proposed law provides the chief resilience officer of DOTD will cooperate with the Federal Insurance Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency in the planning and carrying out of state participation in the National Flood Insurance Program and will aid, advise, and cooperate with parishes and municipalities attempting to qualify for participation in the program. Proposed law retains present law and removes chief resilience office of DOTD as the designee.

Proposed law changes terminology from "upland" area to "noncoastal" area.

Present law provides the Coordinated Use of Resources for Recreation, Economy, Navigation, and Transportation Authority also known as the "authority", is established as the single coordinating entity responsible for prioritizing, planning, and funding projects related to flood control, risk reduction, navigation, and water resource management in all areas of the state not included within the coastal area. Proposed law retains present law and changes terminology from "risk reduction" to "flood risk reduction", and changes from "water resource management" to "floodplain and watershed management".

Present law provides the authority will implement policy addressing issues related to water quantity, flood risk mitigation, navigation, economic development, and recreation. Proposed law changes terminology from "water quantity" to "watershed management" and adds "floodplain management" to the responsibilities of the authority.

Present law provides the definition of "integrated" as the coordinated planning, funding, construction, and operation of flood control, navigation, recreation, water management, and economic development projects to ensure efficient use of resources, minimize conflicts, and promote sustainable development. Proposed law retains present law and adds "floodplain

management" to the definition. Proposed law further changes from "water management" to "watershed management" in the definition. Proposed law further provides for the definition of the term "upland" to be replaced and used by the term "noncoastal".

Present law provides the board shall have 16 members. Proposed law retains present law. Proposed law further provides certain members of the authority are subject to Senate confirmation and serve as members of the board unless a gubernatorial designee is appointed to serve.

Present law provides the secretary of LED will be a member of the authority and serve as a nonvoting member until gubernatorial designation of an alternative. Proposed law provides the agency authority member will change from secretary of LED to the executive director of CPRA.

Present law provides for board members from ports located within the upland parishes. Proposed law retains present law and changes from one member to no more than two members from noncoastal parishes.

Present law provides the board will not consist of more than two levee boards. Proposed law changes from two levee boards to three levee districts.

Proposed law provides for technical changes.

Present law provides adoption by the board of the master plan after submission to the House Committee on Natural Resources and Environment and the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and the House Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works and the Senate Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works for approval. In addition, the annual plan shall be submitted to the House Committee on Natural Resources and Environment and the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and the House Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works and the Senate Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works on or before the fifteenth day of the regular legislative session of each year. Proposed law removes provision for submission to House Committee on Natural Resources and Environment and the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and instead receive approval at meeting of the House and the Senate Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works.

Present law provides the board oversee riverine flood management, inland navigation, and water resource infrastructure within the noncoastal area. Proposed law retains present law and changes the responsibility from water resource infrastructure to flood control infrastructure and makes further technical changes from "upland" to "noncoastal".

1. Changes a member of the Red River Compact Commission from the secretary of the Dept. of Conservation and Energy to the Secretary of the Dept. of Transportation and Development.
2. Change agency responsible to pay the per diem of the member appointed by the governor to represent the State from the Secretary of the Dept. of Conservation and Energy to the Secretary of the Dept. of Transportation and Development.
3. Removes the requirement of the House an Senate transportation committees to meet jointly.
4. Provides for appointments made by the governor.
5. Makes technical changes.
