HEALTH/MEDICAL TREATMENT EG NO IMPACT See Note Page 1 of 1
 Provides relative to the treatment of sexual assault survivors by hospitals and healthcare providers

Present law requires a healthcare provider to provide any medication, including emergency contraception HIV or STI prophylaxis to a sexual assault survivor during the forensic medical examination.

Proposed law modifies present law to require a healthcare provider to provide emergency contraception and HIV and STI post-exposure prophylaxis administered in accordance the Drug Information Handbook.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. Proposed law is not expected to result in an expenditure impact to the state, as it simply modifies present law to require healthcare providers to administer emergency contraception and HIV and STI post-exposure prophylaxis in accordance with the Drug Information Handbook.

Present law already requires healthcare providers to offer and provide medications, including emergency contraception and HIV or STI post-exposure prophylaxis, to sexual assault survivors during the forensic medical examination. Proposed law adds a requirement that such medications be administered in accordance with the Drug Information Handbook.

Note: The LFO assumes that the removal of the three-day supply of medications provision eliminates the expenditure impact previously anticipated for local parish hospitals operated through hospital service districts. An updated estimate of any expenditure impact has been requested from the Police Jury Association of Louisiana. Should additional information regarding estimated expenditures become available, this fiscal note will be revised accordingly.
