SENATE BILL NO. 10

BY SENATORS NEVERS AND MURRAY

UNEMPLOYMENT COMP. Provides for unemployment compensation benefits. (gov sig)

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 23:1474(J), relative to unemployment compensation; to provide with respect
3 to the maximum amount of wages on which contribution rates are assessed; to
4 suspend the application of reductions in weekly benefit amounts payable to
5 claimants; to provide for the state unemployment trust fund; and to provide for
6 related matters.

7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

8 Section 1. R.S. 23:1474(J) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

9 §1474. Administrator; Revenue Estimating Conference; "wages"; weekly benefit
10 amounts

11 * * *

12 **J. Notwithstanding any provisions in this Section to the contrary, for**
13 **calendar year 2006, the administrator shall apply Procedure 3 of the table in**
14 **Subsection I of this Section.**

15 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
16 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
17 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If

1 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
2 effective on the day following such approval.

DIGEST

Nevers (SB 10)

Present law delineates eight procedures for the administrator to utilize in computing unemployment benefits based on the balance in the Unemployment Trust Fund.

Proposed law requires that the fund administrator use Procedure 3 (used when the applied trust fund balance is equal to or greater than \$900 million) when determining benefits in calendar year 2006.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
