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TAX/AD VALOREM TAX EG NO IMPACT See Note Page 1 of 1

Provides with respect to the deferment of tax payments where property subject to ad valorem taxation has been damaged during a gubernatorially declared disaster or emergency (Item #40)

Purpose of Bill: Present law provides that whenever general destruction of crops or other public calamity render impracticable the collection of taxes, there shall be no collection of taxes on lands or other property during the year of calamity, or for the preceding year when the payment of taxes for the preceding year is affected by the calamity.

This measure also provides that a property owner wishing to postpone payment of taxes shall make a sworn statement providing certain information no later than 30 days after the tax bill has been mailed.
