CRIME: Creates the crime of harboring, concealing, or sheltering an alien

2	To enact Division 6 of Subpart A of Part VI of Chapter 1 of Title 14 of the Louisiana
3	Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 14:100.21, relative to aliens; to
4	create the crime of unlawfully harboring, concealing, or sheltering an alien; to
5	provide for definitions; to provide for penalties; to provide for affirmative defenses;
6	and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. Division 6 of Subpart A of Part VI of Chapter 1 of Title 14 of the
9	Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 14:100.21, is hereby enacted to read
0	as follows:
1	<u>6. ALIENS</u>
12	§100.21. Unlawful harboring, concealing, or sheltering of an alien
13	A. It shall be unlawful for any person to harbor, conceal, or shelter from
14	detection any alien in any place within the state of Louisiana, including any building,
15	when the offender has knowledge of the fact that the alien has entered or remained
16	in the United States in violation of law and if either of the following occur:
17	(1) The offender has the intent of assisting the alien in eluding a federal, state
18	or local law enforcement agency, or the United States Citizenship and Immigration
19	Services Bureau; or
20	(2) The offender has the intent of assisting the alien in avoiding or escaping
21	arrest, trial, conviction, or punishment.

1	B. For the purposes of this Section, "alien" has the same meaning as defined
2	in the Immigration and Nationality Act, 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(3).
3	C. Nothing in this Section shall be construed so as to prohibit or restrict the
4	provision of any state or local public benefit described in 8 U.S.C. 1621(b), or
5	regulated public health services provided by a private charity using private funds.
6	D.(1) Whoever commits the crime of unlawfully harboring, concealing, or
7	sheltering an alien on a first conviction shall be fined not more than one thousand
8	dollars, or imprisoned for not more than six months, or both.
9	(2) Whoever commits the crime of unlawfully harboring, concealing, or
10	sheltering an alien on a second or subsequent conviction shall be fined not more than
11	two thousand dollars, or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both.
12	E. The following shall be affirmative defenses to prosecution under this
13	Section:
14	(1) The person was providing humanitarian aid as a designated
15	representative of a nonprofit organization which is tax exempt pursuant to Section
16	501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
17	(2) The person was the attorney or his designee, or such other persons
18	authorized to represent clients in immigration matters pursuant to 8 C.F.R. §1292.1,
19	or their designee, and who was assisting the alien and providing representation to the
20	alien in the course and scope of the attorney's or other authorized representative's
21	employment.

Geymann HB No. 1357

Abstract: Creates the crime of illegally harboring, concealing, or sheltering an alien.

Proposed law provides that it shall be unlawful for any person to harbor, conceal, or shelter from detection any alien in any place within the state of La., including any building or means of transportation, knowing or in reckless disregard of the fact that the alien has entered or remained in the U.S. in violation of law.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words underscored are additions.

REENGROSSED HB NO. 1357

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "alien" as any person who is not a U.S. citizen, who is physically present in the U.S. without the legal right to remain in the U.S.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that whoever commits the crime of unlawfully harboring, concealing, or sheltering an alien on a first conviction shall be fined not more than \$1,000, or imprisoned for not more than six months, or both. Whoever commits the crime of unlawfully harboring, concealing, or sheltering an alien on a second or subsequent conviction shall be fined not more than \$2,000, or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both.

Proposed law provides for affirmative defenses.

1. Amends the affirmative defense regarding the attorney of an alien to include other persons authorized to represent clients in immigration matters or their designees.
