Requires instruction with respect to dating violence in public schools

The proposed legislation requires the governing authority of each public school, including charter schools, to provide students in grades seven through twelve enrolled in Health Education classes instruction related to dating violence. The instruction shall include the definition of dating violence, dating violence warning signs, and characteristics of healthy relationships.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

State general fund and local expenditures may slightly increase as a result of providing instruction related to dating violence. The Department of Education may incur minimal administrative costs to update its model curriculum in regards to dating violence. The Legislative Fiscal Office believes that the cost would be minimal to the local school districts due to organizations providing free curriculum and handbooks on dating violence prevention. For school districts that do not currently offer this instruction, there may be one-time costs associated with modifying the health education curriculum. Links to free curriculum may be provided by the Department of Education for local school districts to access.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
