TEACHERS/SALARY SCHEDULE OR SEE FISC NOTE LF EX Page 1 of 1
 Provides relative to salaries for teachers and other school and school system employees

The proposed legislation restates provisions in current law as enacted by Act 1 of the 2012 Regular Legislative Session relative to salary schedules established for teachers, administrators, and other certified school personnel and pay increases for teachers or administrators rated "ineffective". The legislation requires the local superintendent use the established salary schedule to determine the salaries of teachers and other employees. The date for the salary schedules to be published is changed from January 1, 2013 to July 1, 2013 and will become effective for the 2014-15 school year. Any salary schedule established and published between July 1, 2012 and July 1, 2013 shall become effective no later than the beginning of the 2013-14 school year and shall remain in effect until a new schedule is established.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. It is assumed the school systems currently meet the requirements of the proposed legislation relative to establishing salary schedules due to the January 1, 2013 deadline in current law which was passed last year through Act 1 of the 2012 Regular Legislative Session. A ruling by Judge Michael Caldwell declared all of Act 1 to be unconstitutional because the legislation did not meet the "one object" requirement in the constitution. However, there is no anticipated change in expenditures resulting from the proposed legislation as the school systems should already have the new salary schedules in place to implement during the 2013-14 school year.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
