



1 unaffordable flood insurance premiums but also with the inability to transfer or sell property  
2 deemed by FEMA to be at higher risk of flooding; and

3 WHEREAS, legislation and amendments are pending in Congress to delay the  
4 premium increases authorized by the Biggert-Waters Act for one year to determine the  
5 effects of such changes upon the availability, affordability, and sustainability of flood  
6 insurance; and

7 WHEREAS, FEMA is also now in discussions to reconsider and revise its flood-risk  
8 maps to include the effects of locally-built levees, pumping stations, and floodgates, all of  
9 which have been funded, designed, and built to provide substantial protection from flooding,  
10 and also to develop new maps that more accurately reflect actual area flood risk; and

11 WHEREAS, it is necessary for both Congress and FEMA to take immediate action  
12 to prevent pending and unintended economic catastrophe for coastal communities,  
13 individuals, and businesses; and

14 WHEREAS, without action by both Congress and FEMA, it has been estimated that  
15 at least half a million homes and businesses in Louisiana could be severely impacted, and  
16 that other coastal communities outside of Louisiana could face similar economic devastation,  
17 including communities, individuals, and businesses in New York, New Jersey, and other  
18 states severely damaged by Hurricane Sandy in 2012.

19 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana memorializes  
20 the Congress of the United States to prevent unnecessary and unintended harm to coastal  
21 communities, individuals, and businesses by immediately amending or repealing the  
22 Biggert-Waters Act and mandating revision of Federal Emergency Management Agency  
23 flood-risk maps.

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted  
25 to the secretary of the United States Senate and the clerk of the United States House of  
26 Representatives, and to each member of the Louisiana delegation to the United States  
27 Congress, and to the administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency.
