CONDOLENCES: Expresses condolences upon the death of Chief Warrant Officer Bryan James Henderson of Winnsboro

A RESOLUTION

2	To express the condolences of the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana
3	upon the death of United States Army Chief Warrant Officer Bryan James
4	Henderson, of Winnsboro, Louisiana.
5	WHEREAS, it is with profound sadness that the members of the House of
6	Representatives have learned of the death of United States Army Chief Warrant Officer
7	Bryan James Henderson, who was killed in the service of his country on March 11, 2013,
8	in Afghanistan; and
9	WHEREAS, on June 29, 1985, Jimmy and Kim Henderson proudly welcomed the
10	arrival of their newborn son, Bryan James Henderson, to Monroe, Louisiana; and
11	WHEREAS, growing up with a love of the outdoors, young Bryan hunted, fished,
12	skied, scuba dived, and camped, all of which served as preparation for the rigors of military
13	life; and
14	WHEREAS, Bryan Henderson graduated from Winnsboro High School and
15	completed his secondary education at the University of Louisiana at Monroe in 2006,
16	graduating with a bachelor of science degree in aviation; and
17	WHEREAS, heeding the call of his country, Bryan Henderson enlisted in the United
18	States Army in 2007, where he immediately went to work, attached to the 4th Battalion, 3rd
19	Aviation Regiment, 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division based at Hunter
20	Army Airfield in Georgia; and

1	WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Henderson served the United States Army with
2	great courage and valor as evidenced by his receipt of two Army Commendation medals, the
3	Army Achievement Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Afghanistan Campaign
4	Medal with a Bronze Service Star, the Iraq Campaign Medal with a Bronze Service Star, the
5	Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Army Service Ribbon Overseas, the Service
6	Ribbon NATO Medal, the Army Meritorious Unit Commendation, the Overseas Service Bar,
7	and the Posthumous Combat Action Badge; and
8	WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Henderson was a front-line fighter in the war on
9	terrorism, a soldier in Operation Enduring Freedom who was on his second deployment and
10	was a pilot onboard the helicopter which tragically crashed and ended his life in its twenty-
11	seventh year; and
12	WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Henderson left an indelible mark on the staff and
13	students of his high school alma mater, some seven hundred fifty of whom attended a
14	memorial service in his honor; and
15	WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer Henderson's passion for his country and
16	community will forever remain in the hearts and minds of his wife, Trista Henderson, his
17	daughter, Aria Cruz Johnson, his brother, Seth Henderson, parents, and family members; and
18	WHEREAS, the sacrifices made by the great men and women who protect and
19	defend the Constitution and these United States must always be acknowledged by those who
20	are left behind to honor their memory; and
21	WHEREAS, it is with great pride that the House of Representatives records for
22	posterity the extraordinary dedication and commitment to his country that Chief Warrant
23	Officer Henderson displayed throughout his life and in the performance of his duties in the
24	military service.
25	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives
26	of the Legislature of Louisiana do hereby express their condolences and most heartfelt
27	sorrow to the family of United States Army Chief Warrant Officer Bryan James Henderson
28	and do hereby acknowledge and record for posterity the unique and special contributions of
29	Chief Warrant Officer Henderson to the town of Winnsboro, to Franklin Parish, to the state
30	of Louisiana, and to the United States of America.
