HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 186

HEALTH/DHH: Requests DHH to protect LSU Health Sciences Center - Shreveport hospitals from consequences of privatization which are detrimental to public health and finance, and to adequately compensate other hospitals of north and central La. for any increased burden of providing care to the poor and uninsured resulting from privatization of public hospitals

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Department of Health and Hospitals to take actions to protect the
3	three hospitals of the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center - Shreveport
4	from consequences of privatization which are detrimental to public health and
5	finance, and to adequately compensate other hospitals of the north Louisiana and
6	central Louisiana regions for any increased burden of providing care to the poor and
7	uninsured resulting from privatization of public hospitals.
8	WHEREAS, because the essential fiscal and health policy aspects of cooperative
9	endeavor agreements to privatize state hospitals are being developed in secret, the following
10	matters remain unknown to the Legislature of Louisiana as of the date of filing of this
11	Resolution:
12	(1) Whether the privatization effort will result in cost savings or cost increases to the
13	state.
14	(2) Whether the privatization effort will improve or jeopardize graduate medical
15	education and physician training programs.
16	(3) Whether the privatization effort will enhance or diminish access to health care
17	by those with the greatest need; and

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- 1 WHEREAS, pursuant to R.S. 17:1519.2(B)(3), the Louisiana State University Health 2 Sciences Center - Shreveport is responsible for the following hospitals, including all 3 programs and facilities thereof: 4 (1) University Hospital Shreveport. 5 (2) E.A. Conway Medical Center in Monroe. 6 (3) Huey P. Long Medical Center in Pineville; and 7 WHEREAS, these hospitals have long been respected institutions in the north 8 Louisiana region and throughout the state; and 9 WHEREAS, it is an important public health priority that these hospitals maintain or 10 enhance their current level of services; and 11 WHEREAS, the vital public health functions of these hospitals are jeopardized by 12 the current privatization efforts; and 13 WHEREAS, in areas of the state where privatization of public hospitals has 14 progressed further than in north Louisiana, notably in the Baton Rouge region, much of the 15 burden of providing care to the poor and uninsured has fallen on private hospitals in the 16 region surrounding the public hospital; and 17 WHEREAS, providing care to patients formerly served by public hospitals is causing a severe financial strain on private providers, and current Medicaid funding to those 18 19 providers is not sufficient to protect them from financial detriment associated with the 20 provision of such care; and 21 WHEREAS, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services of the United States 22 Department of Health and Human Services is authorized under federal law to allow for 23 changes in state Medicaid programs to serve special populations, compensate for various 24 health services classified officially as "optional", and allow for innovative means of health 25 services financing; and 26 WHEREAS, authorization for such changes in a state's Medicaid program may be 27 granted through a waiver of otherwise applicable federal law and regulations pursuant to Section 1115 of the Social Security Act, commonly known as "Section 1115 Medicaid 28
- 29 demonstration waivers"; and

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- 1 WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Hospitals has successfully implemented 2 programs through Section 1115 Medicaid demonstration waivers, notably in the New 3 Orleans region, that have provided accessible, affordable primary care to the poor and 4 uninsured; and 5 WHEREAS, when implemented effectively, Medicaid waiver programs have the 6 capacity to substantially improve access to health services, the quality of health care, and the 7 overall health of patients and families; and 8 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana does 9 hereby declare that the following are vital public policy priorities of this state: 10 (1) Preserving access to health care services by medically needy patients during and 11 subsequent to privatization of public hospitals. 12 (2) Mitigating or eliminating any barriers to health care access which medically 13 needy persons experience as a result of privatization of public hospitals. 14 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the 15 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Department of Health and 16 Hospitals to take any actions necessary to protect the three hospitals for which the Louisiana 17 State University Health Sciences Center - Shreveport is responsible from consequences of 18 privatization which are detrimental to public health and finance, and that such actions may 19 include but shall not be limited to submission of Section 1115 Medicaid demonstration 20 waiver applications for any programs or funding which may enhance support for such 21 hospitals. 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the Legislature 23 of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Department of Health and Hospitals to take 24 any actions necessary to adequately compensate other hospitals of the north Louisiana and 25 central Louisiana regions for any increased burden of providing care to the poor and 26 uninsured resulting from privatization of public hospitals, and that such actions may include 27 but shall not be limited to submission of Section 1115 Medicaid demonstration waiver 28 applications for any programs or funding which may enhance support for such hospitals.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
 office of the governor, the secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals, and the

- 1 chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and
- 2 Mechanical College.
