CONDOLENCES: Expresses condolences upon the death of Dr. Francis Charles McMains of Baton Rouge

A RESOLUTION

2	To express the condolences of the House of Representatives upon the death of Dr. Francis
3	"Frank" Charles McMains of Baton Rouge.
4	WHEREAS, it is with deep regret and profound sorrow that the Louisiana House of
5	Representatives has learned of the death of Dr. Francis "Frank" Charles McMains on the
6	morning of June 6, 2013, at his home in Baton Rouge; and
7	WHEREAS, Frank McMains was born above his grandparents' store in Dexter, New
8	Mexico, on May 5, 1922, to Orion and Pearl McMains; and
9	WHEREAS, Frank's father was a farmer and his mother was a school teacher, and
10	he attended Grants High School in Grant, New Mexico, where he was a top student and
11	leader and graduated in 1939; and
12	WHEREAS, Frank received his bachelor's degree in pre-med from the University of
13	New Mexico (UNM) while continuing his daily hand milking duties morning and night on
14	the family farm; and
15	WHEREAS, Frank became a member of Sigma Chi Fraternity and remained a
16	committed member throughout his life, and upon graduating from UNM, he was accepted
17	into Tulane Medical School through a United States Navy program that trained doctors for
18	war; and
19	WHEREAS, Frank's matriculation at Tulane gave him not only the preparation for
20	his forty-one year career as an orthopedic surgeon but, most importantly, led him to meet the
21	love of his life, Ann Greer; the two were married after Frank graduated from medical school

in 1946, a union that carried them through sixty-seven years of shared growth, adventure,

- WHEREAS, during his career in the Navy, Dr. and Mrs. McMains lived in New
- 4 Orleans, Pensacola, Washington, D.C., and Virginia Beach; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Dr. and Mrs. McMains eventually moved back to Baton Rouge where
- 6 he served as head resident of Our Lady of the Lake Hospital and later as chief of staff at
- 7 Baton Rouge General; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Dr. McMains and his friend Dr. Willard Dowell cofounded the
- 9 Orthopedic Clinic in Baton Rouge, and Drs. Bill Smith and Charles Kennon later joined the
- 10 clinic; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. McMains was a tireless practitioner, in the words of his successor
- 12 Dr. Barry Rills, "...taking the stairs was faster than the elevator, taking two stair steps instead
- of one was even better, and mopping the surgery room floor between operations made it
- possible to do more surgeries"; and
- WHEREAS, the proudest work of Dr. McMains's career was his volunteer efforts
- 16 every Thursday for thirty-three years at the Cerebral Palsy Center, where he provided
- medical services for disabled kids; he was honored in 2000 for his work when the name of
- 18 the center was changed to the Dr. Frank McMains Children's Development Center; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. McMains was also the volunteer team doctor for football and
- 20 basketball teams at University and Episcopal High School while his five sons were in
- 21 attendance; and
- WHEREAS, throughout his medical career he was proudly affiliated with Tulane's
- 23 Alpha Omega Alpha medical fraternity and the Piedmont Orthopedic Association, and he
- 24 effectively and efficiently served as the medical director of Union National Life Insurance
- for many years; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. McMains was preceded in death by his parents and brother and by
- 27 his third son Richard Orion McMains, and daughter-in-law, Thrye; and

1 WHEREAS, Dr. McMains is survived by his wife Ann, his four sons, Jay, Chuck,

- 2 Tim, Ty and their partners Mary, Zack, and Tracey; thirteen grandchildren, Frank, Emily,
- 3 Daniel, Jake, Will, Cooper, Tess, Ross, Kaplan, Parker, Reed, Parks, and Brooks; and two
- 4 great grandchildren, Annie and Julia; and
- 5 WHEREAS, with the death of Dr. McMains, Louisiana has lost one of her finest
- 6 sons, and he leaves behind a rich and unique legacy of tenacity, determination, integrity,
- 7 strength, and professionalism; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the death of Dr. McMains has left an abiding void in the many lives he
- 9 touched throughout his life, and his memory shall remain eternal in the hearts and minds of
- 10 all those who knew and loved him.
- 11 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the
- 12 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby express its sincere sorrow and heartfelt condolences
- 13 upon the death of Dr. Francis "Frank" Charles McMains, does hereby recognize his
- 14 extraordinary commitment to all of his patients over his career, does hereby record for
- 15 posterity his tremendous gifts and talents, his outstanding abilities as a physician, and his
- 16 generosity and kindness, does hereby extend appreciation for his enduring legacy of
- 17 professionalism and service that will continue to be a source of great pride, inspiration, and
