1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:3394.3(A) and the introductory paragraph of (B) and to enact
3	R.S. 17:3394.3(C) and R.S. 39:1367(E)(2)(b)(v), relative to the issuance of bonds for
4	the financing of capital improvements and enhancements to certain facilities and
5	properties of colleges within the Louisiana Community and Technical Colleges
6	System; to list the projects to be financed; to require private match funds for such
7	projects; to provide that no state funds shall be appropriated for such bonds or
8	projects until July 1, 2015; to provide that such bonds shall not be included in the
9	definition of net state tax supported debt; to provide for an effective date; and to
10	provide for related matters.
11	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
12	Section 1. R.S. 17:3394.3(A) and the introductory paragraph of (B) are hereby
13	amended and reenacted and R.S. 17:3394.3(C) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
14	§3394.3. Authority of board to execute agreements related to the finance of capital
15	improvements and enhancements
16	A.(1) Projects contained in this Section may, at the direction of the
17	board, be funded through the issuance of bonds, notes, or other evidences of
18	indebtedness or through financing programs provided by the Louisiana Local
19	Government Environmental Facilities and Community Development Authority,
20	pursuant to R.S. 33:4548.1 et seq., or a public trust duly organized pursuant to

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1	<b>R.S. 9:2341 et seq., having for its beneficiary the state, with the approval of the</b>
2	State Bond Commission.
3	(2) Bonds, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness may be issued as
4	serial bonds or as term bonds and shall bear such date or dates, mature at such
5	time or times, not exceeding thirty years from their respective dates, bear
6	interest at such rate or rates, including variable, adjustable, or zero interest
7	rates, be payable at such time or times, be in such denominations, be sold at
8	such price or prices, at public or private negotiated sale, after advertisement as
9	is provided for in R.S. 39:1426 et seq., be in such form, carry such registration
10	and exchangeability privileges, be payable at such place or places, be subject to
11	such terms of redemption, as may be provided in the indenture, trust
12	agreement, or resolution relating to such bonds. Bonds, notes, or other
13	evidences of indebtedness may be sold in such manner and from time to time as
14	may be determined by the issuer and the board to be most beneficial, subject to
15	approval of the State Bond Commission.
16	(3) Projects contained in this Section shall not be required to be included
17	in the annual comprehensive capital budget nor obtain legislative approval as
18	<u>provided in R.S. 39:112(G).</u>
19	(4) Construction projects contained in this Section shall be managed and
20	administered by a nonprofit corporation established for such purposes,
21	regardless of the source of revenues used to fund such construction projects.
22	(5) The board shall exercise its authority granted pursuant to R.S. 17:3361,
23	et seq., as may be necessary to provide for the completion of the projects enumerated
24	in this Section. The board may grant leases of property under its supervision to a
25	nonprofit corporation or to an entity authorized to issue bonds as set forth in
26	Paragraph (A)(1) of this Section for the purpose of financing such projects, and the
27	sum total amount to be financed therefor shall equal no more than the total value of
28	all projects listed herein, plus an amount equal to fifteen percent of such total,
29	together with other requirements including but not limited to costs of issuance,
30	capitalized interest, if any, credit enhancement and related costs.

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### **ENROLLED**

1	Notwithstanding any provision of R.S. 17:3361, et seq., to the contrary, the term of
2	any lease agreement made for purposes of this Part shall not exceed thirty years. No
3	monies shall be appropriated for these the purposes set forth in this Part for the
4	projects set forth in Subsection B of this Section until July 1, 2008. No monies
5	shall be appropriated for the purposes set forth in this Part for the projects set
6	forth in Subsection C of this Section until July 1, 2015.
7	B. For the purposes of this Part, the following projects and the projects set
8	forth in Subsection C of this Section shall comprise the entirety of public facilities
9	and projects to be financed under the authorities of this Part and R.S. 17:3361 et seq.
10	with respect to these projects. The dollar value listed, plus an amount equal to fifteen
11	percent, together with other requirements including but not limited to costs of
12	issuance, capitalized interest, if any, credit enhancement and related costs, is the
13	maximum amount that may be financed for each of the following projects:

15	C. The projects set forth in Subsection B of this Section and the
16	following projects shall comprise the entirety of public facilities and projects to
17	be financed under the authorities of this Part and R.S. 17:3361 et seq., with
18	respect to these projects. Each project set forth below shall require a no less
19	than twelve percent private match. No project shall be financed until all private
20	funds are available for that project. The dollar value listed for each project,
	plus an amount equal to fifteen percent, together with other requirements

8	Section 2. R.S. 39:1367(E)(2)(b)(v) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§1367. State debt; limitations

11	E. As used in this Section, the following terms shall have the following
12	meanings ascribed to them unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

15	(b) "Net state tax supported debt" shall not mean:

17	(v) Any bond, note, or other evidence of indebtedness issued for the
18	purpose of financing the projects set forth in R.S. 17:3394.3(C) or any bonds
19	issued to refund such bonds, notes, or evidence of indebtedness.
20	Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
21	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
22	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
23	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
24	effective on the day following such approval.
