CONTROL DANGER SUBSTANCE. Repeals the crime of drug-traffic loitering. (8/1/14)

1 AN ACT

2 To repeal R.S. 40:981.4, relative to drug-traffic loitering; to repeal the crime of drug-traffic
3 loitering; and to provide for related matters.

4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

5 Section 1. R.S. 40:981.4 is hereby repealed.

DIGEST

Mills (SB275)

Present law creates the crime of drug-traffic loitering. Provides for elements of the crime, definitions, and penalties.

Present law was found unconstitutional by the Louisiana Supreme Court in *State vs Muschkat*, 706 So. 2d 429, 96-2922 (La. 3/14/98).

Proposed law repeals present law.

Effective August 1, 2014.
