BOARDS/COMMISSIONS: Provides relative to the Louisiana Commission on HIV, AIDS, and Hepatitis C

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 40:2018.1(A), (B), and (G), relative to the Louisiana
3 Commission on HIV, AIDS, and Hepatitis C; to change the composition and
4 membership of the commission; to provide for an extension of the termination date;
5 and to provide for related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 40:2018.1(A), (B), and (G) are hereby amended and reenacted to
8 read as follows:

9 §2018.1. Louisiana Commission on HIV, AIDS and Hepatitis C

10 A. There shall be established within the office of the governor a commission
11 which shall be designated the "Louisiana Commission on HIV, AIDS, and Hepatitis
12 C", composed of ~~forty-four~~ thirty-five members, as provided in Subsection B of this
13 Section.

14 B.(1) ~~Twenty-nine~~ Twenty-two members shall serve at the governor's
15 pleasure and shall be appointed by the governor as follows:

16 (a)(i) Two persons infected with the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV),
17 at least one of whom represents a racial or ethnic subpopulation.

18 (ii) Two persons infected with hepatitis C, where one person is co-infected
19 with HIV, and at least one of whom represents a racial or ethnic subpopulation.

1 (b)(i) Two representatives from community-based provider organizations
2 providing services to persons infected with the human immunodeficiency virus, one
3 of which represents a racial or ethnic subpopulation.

4 (ii) Two medically qualified representatives from a medical provider or
5 community-based provider organizations providing services to persons infected with
6 hepatitis C or HIV, one of which represents a racial or ethnic subpopulation.

7 (c) One representative from the Louisiana Primary Care Association.

12 health services financing, respectively.

13 ~~(5)~~ (d) The commissioner of the Department of Insurance or his designee.

14 ~~(6) The secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals or his designee.~~

16 Medicine or his designee who has an affiliation with the Infectious Disease
17 Department.

19 his designee who has an affiliation with the Infectious Disease Department.

20 ~~(9)~~ (g) The dean of ~~Xavier University College~~ one of the Colleges of
21 Pharmacy in Louisiana or his designee who has an affiliation with the HIV/AIDS or
22 hepatitis C practice.

23 (h) One member of the Louisiana Hospital Association.

24 (3) Two members shall be appointed as follows:

25 ~~(10)~~ (a) One member of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate.

27 speaker of the House of Representatives.

28 ~~(12) The commissioner of administration or his designee.~~

3 ~~(14) (4)~~ (4) The governor shall strive for diversity in geography, race, sex, and
4 educational background in appointing members to the commission. Each member
5 appointed by the governor shall serve at his pleasure and shall be subject to Senate
6 confirmation. The legislative members shall serve at the pleasure of the presiding
7 officer of the respective legislative body.

Abstract: Changes the composition of the La. Commission on HIV, AIDS, and Hepatitis C.

Present law establishes the "La. Commission on HIV, AIDS, and Hepatitis C" and provides for the membership of the commission.

Proposed law retains present law but changes the composition of the board to decrease the amount of members from 44 to 35, as follows:

- (1) 22 members shall serve at the governor's pleasure and shall be appointed by the governor as follows:
 - (a) Two persons infected with the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), at least one of whom represents a racial or ethnic subpopulation.
 - (b) Two persons infected with hepatitis C, where one person is co-infected with HIV, and at least one of whom represents a racial or ethnic subpopulation.
 - (c) Two representatives from community-based provider organizations providing services to persons infected with HIV, one of which represents a racial or ethnic subpopulation.
 - (d) Two medically qualified representatives from a medical provider or community-based provider organizations providing services to persons infected with hepatitis C or HIV, one of which represents a racial or ethnic subpopulation.
 - (e) A representative from the La. Primary Care Association.
 - (f) Two representatives from the statewide HIV Community Planning Group.

CODING: Words in ~~struck through~~ type are deletions from existing law; words underscored are additions.

- (g) A nurse representative from the La. Nursing Association, serving patients with HIV or hepatitis C.
 - (h) A social worker representative from the La. Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers.
 - (i) Five Ryan White Treatment and Modernization Act grantees consisting of at least one Part A grantee, one Part B grantee, one Part C grantee, one Part D grantee, and a representative of the Delta Region AIDS and Education Training Center.
 - (j) A representative from the La. Psychological Association.
 - (k) A representative from the La. faith-based community.
 - (l) A representative from a dental provider serving patients with HIV or hepatitis C.
 - (m) The president of the La. State Medical Society or his designee.
- (2) 11 members shall be appointed by the governor by virtue of their position as follows:
- (a) The superintendent of the Dept. of Education or his designee.
 - (b) The secretary of the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections or his designee.
 - (c) Four representatives from the Dept. of Health and Hospitals, who have knowledge of policies related to HIV, AIDS, and hepatitis C, and who work in the office of public health, office of behavioral health, and the office of health services financing, respectively.
 - (d) The commissioner of the Dept. of Insurance or his designee.
 - (e) The dean of the LSU School of Medicine or his designee who has an affiliation with the Infectious Disease Department.
 - (f) The dean of the Tulane University School of Medicine or his designee who has an affiliation with the Infectious Disease Department.
 - (g) The dean of one of the Colleges of Pharmacy in La. or his designee who has an affiliation with the HIV/AIDS or hepatitis C practice.
 - (h) A member of the La. Hospital Association.
- (3) Two members shall be appointed as follows:
- (a) A member of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate.
 - (b) A member of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives.

Proposed law changes the termination date of present law from Sept. 1, 2014 to Sept. 1, 2017.
