CRIMINAL/PROCEDURE EG SEE FISC NOTE RV See Note Revises provisions of law regarding expungement

<u>Proposed law</u> moves expungement provisions of law from provisions regarding public records to the Code of Criminal Procedure. <u>Present law</u> provides for the expungement of records of arrest and misdemeanor convictions in certain circumstances. <u>Present law</u> provides for the following fees for expungement: (1) The LA Bureau of Criminal Identification

and Information may charge \$250. (2) The sheriff may charge \$50. (3) The district attorney may charge \$50. Authorizes the clerk to charge an administrative fee of up to \$200. Proposed law retains present law and makes the fees nonrefundable.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

Present law provides for amounts of expungement fees that can be charged by the Louisiana Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information, sheriffs, and district attorneys, as well as administrative fees by the clerks of court. Proposed law makes these fees nonrefundable. The impact of the legislation is indeterminable since it is not known how much of these fees was refunded previously. However, the impact should be minimal since these fees were rarely refunded.
