# CONGRESS: Urges Louisiana's congressional delegation to support a national moratorium on the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Louisiana congressional delegation to support a national moratorium
3	on implementation and enforcement of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care
4	Act for a period of at least three years.
5	WHEREAS, the separation of powers between the branches of the federal
6	government and between federal and state authority is essential to the preservation of
7	individual liberty; and
8	WHEREAS, the Constitution of the United States creates a federal government with
9	limited, enumerated powers, and reserves to the states or to the people those powers not
10	granted to the federal government; and
11	WHEREAS, with respect to health care, the United States Congress has enacted laws
12	that preempt the laws of states and place an increasing strain on state budgets, in turn
13	impeding the ability of states to meet other critical responsibilities such as those relative to
14	education, infrastructure, and public safety; and
15	WHEREAS, it is the public policy of Louisiana to protect individual liberty and
16	personal control over healthcare decisions; and
17	WHEREAS, in furtherance of this policy of protecting individual liberty, the
18	Legislature of Louisiana hereby declares that regulatory authority over health care should
19	be vested in the states; and
