PHYSICAL THERAPISTS: Eliminates restrictions on performance of physical therapy services without a prescription or referral

| 2 | To amend and reenact R.S. 37:2418(B) and to repeal R.S. 37:2418(C) and (D), relative to |

| 5 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 6 | Section 1. R.S. 37:2418(B) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: |
| 7 | §2418. Authority to practice as a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant |

| 9 | B. Without prescription or referral, a physical therapist may perform an |
| 10 | initial evaluation or consultation of a screening nature to determine the need for |
| 11 | physical therapy and may perform physical therapy or other services provided in |
| 12 | Subsection C of this Section. However, implementation of A physical therapist may |
| 13 | implement physical therapy treatment shall otherwise be based on the with or |
| 14 | without a prescription or referral of a person licensed to practice medicine, surgery, |

| 17 | Section 2. R.S. 37:2418(C) and (D) are hereby repealed in their entirety. |

| 20 | by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If |

Brown HB No. 1064

Abstract: Eliminates restrictions on performance of physical therapy services without a prescription or referral.

<u>Present law</u> provides that except under certain circumstances as specified in <u>present law</u>, physical therapy treatment may only be implemented based on the prescription or referral of a person licensed to practice medicine, surgery, dentistry, podiatry, or chiropractic.

<u>Proposed law</u> revises <u>present law</u> to provide that a physical therapist may render physical therapy treatment with or without a type of prescription or referral provided for in <u>present</u> law.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> which provides that physical therapy services performed without a prescription or referral from a person licensed to practice medicine, surgery, dentistry, podiatry, or chiropractic shall not be construed as any of the following:

- (1) Mandating coverage for physical therapy services under any health care plan, insurance policy, or workers' compensation plan.
- (2) Circumventing any requirement for preauthorization of services in accordance with any health care plan, insurance policy, or workers' compensation plan.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals provisions of <u>present law</u> which become inapplicable pursuant to <u>proposed law</u>.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
