Present law provides for the regulation of explosives by the Department of Public Safety. Proposed law retains present law and authorizes the deputy secretary or his designee to inspect all facilities for the manufacture, transportation, storage, and use of explosives by any person licensed for various explosive licenses.

Proposed law requires that each manfucaturer, dealer-distributor, and user shall possess a valid explosives license or permit from the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives.
