## A RESOLUTION

To recognize Tuesday, April 8, 2014, as March of Dimes Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.

WHEREAS, in Louisiana over 62,000 babies are born each year and 9,400 of those babies are born prematurely and March of Dimes has helped each and every one of those babies through its research, education, vaccines, and breakthroughs; and

WHEREAS, on Tuesday, April 8, 2014, March of Dimes volunteers and staff from across the state are visiting the Louisiana State Capitol to raise awareness of the serious need to protect Louisiana babies and to advocate for policies that improve the quality of care for Louisiana moms and babies.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby welcome volunteers and staff of March of Dimes and recognize Tuesday, April 8, 2014, as March of Dimes Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.
