HOUSE BILL NO. 1062

SNAP/FOOD STAMPS: Provides for a task force to make recommendations concerning electronic issuance of SNAP benefits

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 46:311 through 313, relative to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
3 Program; to create and provide for a task force to study and make recommendations
4 concerning electronic benefits disbursement by the Department of Children and
5 Family Services; to provide for termination of the task force; to provide for
6 redesignation of laws; and to provide for related matters.

7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

8 Section 1. R.S. 46:311 through 313 are hereby enacted to read as follows:

9 §311. Legislative findings; purpose

10 A. The legislature hereby finds the following:

11 (1) The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, referred to hereafter in
12 this Subpart as "SNAP", is the major food assistance program of this state.

13 (2) SNAP provides support to needy households and to persons making the
14 transition from welfare to work.

15 (3) It is the policy of this state to operate SNAP in a manner that maximizes
16 administrative efficiency in delivery of food assistance to eligible children and
17 families.

18 B. The legislature hereby declares that the purpose of this Subpart is to
19 further this state's policy of fiscal soundness and efficiency in administration of
20 public benefits programs by establishing a task force to study and make

1 recommendations concerning policies, procedures, and technical processes relative
2 to electronic disbursement of SNAP benefits by the Department of Children and
3 Family Services.

4 §312. Task force on SNAP electronic benefits issuance; membership; purpose

5 A. There is hereby created within the Department of Children and Family
6 Services a task force on SNAP electronic benefits issuance, referred to hereafter as
7 the "task force".

8 B. The task force shall be composed of the following twelve members:

9 (1) Two members appointed by the commissioner of administration, at least
10 one of whom shall be an employee in the office of information technology.

11 (2) Two members appointed by the secretary of the Department of Children
12 and Family Services, at least one of whom is an employee in the division of
13 programs of the department.

14 (3) The executive director of the Louisiana Retailers Association or his
15 designee.

16 (4) The president of the Louisiana Association of Business and Industry or
17 his designee.

18 (5) The vice president of public affairs of the National Grocers Association
19 or his designee.

20 (6) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker
21 of the House of Representatives.

22 (7) One member of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate.

23 (8) One member representing the Louisiana State University Agricultural
24 Center.

25 (9) One member representing the Southern University Agricultural Center.

26 (10) The executive director of the Louisiana Food Bank Association or his
27 designee.

28 C. The members of the task force shall select one member to serve as
29 chairman.

1 D. The purposes of the task force shall include the following:

2 (1) To study on an ongoing basis the policies, procedures, and technical
3 processes by which the Department of Children and Family Services disburses
4 SNAP benefits electronically.

5 (2) To consider the impacts on Louisiana families and businesses of
6 prospective policy changes relative to the disbursement schedule for SNAP benefits.

7 (3) To keep abreast of changes in federal laws and regulations which relate
8 in any manner to electronic issuance of public benefits.

9 (4) To make recommendations to the secretary of the Department of
10 Children and Family Services, on a schedule determined by the chairman,
11 concerning innovations in electronic benefits issuance policies and systems.

12 E. The task force shall convene on or before September 1, 2014.

13 §313. Termination

14 The provisions of this Subpart shall terminate on September 1, 2015.

15 Section 2.(A) The Louisiana State Law Institute is hereby directed to redesignate
16 Subpart E of Part II of Chapter 3 of Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950,
17 comprised of R.S. 46:291.1, as Subpart E-1 of Part II of Chapter 3 of Title 46 of the
18 Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 46:291.1, and is further directed to
19 retain the heading of the Subpart.

20 (B) The Louisiana State Law Institute is hereby directed to redesignate Subpart A-1
21 of Part II of Chapter 3 of Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, comprised of
22 R.S. 46:236.1, as Subpart E-2 of Part II of Chapter 3 of Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised
23 Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 46:301, and is further directed to change the heading of
24 the Subpart to "SNAP Nutrition Education".

25 (C) The Louisiana State Law Institute is hereby directed to designate R.S. 46:311
26 through 313, as enacted by this Act, as Subpart E-3 of Part II of Chapter 3 of Title 46 of the
27 Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, and is further directed to apply to the Subpart the
28 heading "Task Force on SNAP Electronic Benefits Issuance".

Abstract: Provides for a task force to study and make recommendations to the Dept. of Children and Family Services concerning electronic issuance of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits.

Proposed law establishes a task force to study and make recommendations concerning policies, procedures, and technical processes relative to electronic disbursement of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits by the Dept. of Children and Family Services (DCFS). Provides that the task force shall be composed of the following 12 members:

- (1) Two members appointed by the commissioner of administration, at least one of whom shall be an employee in the office of information technology.
- (2) Two members appointed by the secretary of DCFS, at least one of whom is an employee in the division of programs of the department.
- (3) The executive director of the La. Retailers Association or his designee.
- (4) The president of the La. Association of Business and Industry or his designee.
- (5) The vice president of public affairs of the National Grocers Association or his designee.
- (6) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of the House.
- (7) One member of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate.
- (8) One member representing the Louisiana State University Agricultural Center.
- (9) One member representing the Southern University Agricultural Center.
- (10) The executive director of the La. Food Bank Association or his designee.

Proposed law provides that the purposes of the task force include the following:

- (1) To study on an ongoing basis the policies, procedures, and technical processes by which DCFS disburses SNAP benefits electronically.
- (2) To consider the impact on Louisiana families and businesses of prospective policy changes relative to the disbursement schedule for SNAP benefits.
- (3) To keep abreast of changes in federal laws and regulations which relate in any manner to electronic issuance of public benefits.
- (4) To make recommendations to the secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services, on a schedule determined by the chairman, concerning innovations in electronic benefits issuance policies and systems.

Proposed law provides that the task force shall convene on or before Sept. 1, 2014, and shall terminate on Sept. 1, 2015.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Health and Welfare to the original bill.

1. Added the executive director of the Louisiana Food Bank Association or his designee as a member of the task force provided for in proposed law.
2. Added provision requiring the task force to convene on or before Sept. 1, 2014.
3. Changed termination date of task force from Sept. 1, 2017 to Sept. 1, 2015.
