CORRECTIONS: Provides for the creation of a pilot program to rehabilitate and support offenders

AN ACT

| 2 | To enact Part I-E of Chapter 7 of Title 15 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be |
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| 3 | comprised of R.S. 15:745 through 745.3, relative to the reentry of offenders who are |
| 4 | housed in parish jails; to create an Offender Reentry Support Pilot Program; to |
| 5 | provide for the establishment of a pilot program in Pointe Coupee Parish; to provide |
| 6 | that the program shall be maintained by the Pointe Coupee Parish Sheriff; to provide |
| 7 | offenders with assistance to facilitate reentry into society following incarceration: |
| 8 | to provide for the criteria for development of the pilot program; to provide for an |
| 9 | advisory council to assist with the implementation of the pilot program; to provide |
| 10 | for the membership of the council; to provide for a report of program results; and to |
| 11 | provide for related matters. |
| 12 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 13 | Section 1. Part I-E of Chapter 7 of Title 15 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of |
| 14 | 1950, comprised of R.S. 15:745 through 745.3, is hereby enacted to read as follows: |
| 15 | PART I-E. OFFENDER REENTRY SUPPORT |
| 16 | §745. Short title |
| 17 | This Part shall be known as the "Offender Reentry Support Act". |
| 18 | §745.1. Declaration of public policy |
| 19 | A. The goals of incarceration in the criminal justice system are as follows: |
| 20 | (1) To protect the citizens of the state of Louisiana. |

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CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

| 1 | (2) To punish conduct which is defined as criminal by the legislature. |
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| 2 | (3) To deter future conduct which is defined as criminal by the legislature. |
| 3 | (4) To rehabilitate offenders so that they may be reintroduced into society |
| 4 | as law-abiding citizens. |
| 5 | B. The legislature recognizes that when ex-offenders return to their |
| 6 | communities and families, they face numerous challenges to their successful reentry |
| 7 | into the community. Among these challenges, the most difficult to overcome are the |
| 8 | barriers to employment. |
| 9 | C. It is the intention of the legislature that this Part will provide opportunities |
| 10 | to break the cycle of criminal recidivism, increase public safety, and assist the |
| 11 | growing population of criminal offenders reentering the community to establish a |
| 12 | self-sustaining life through opportunities in employment. |
| 13 | D. The legislature hereby declares that it shall be the public policy of this |
| 14 | state to promote initiatives that will provide ex-offenders with the support and |
| 15 | services necessary to allow them to find employment and make healthy connections |
| 16 | with their families and communities. Such initiatives can help ex-offenders to |
| 17 | become productively engaged with their communities, to work and support their |
| 18 | families, and thus make both their communities safer and their families economically |
| 19 | secure. |
| 20 | E. The legislature further recognizes the excellence that the standardized |
| 21 | reentry programs developed by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections |
| 22 | have had on the successful reentry of many ex-offenders into their communities. As |
| 23 | a result of these successes, the legislature believes that it is equally important to |
| 24 | replicate such programs in local and regional correctional facilities where |
| 25 | statistically larger numbers of offenders are released each year. |
| 26 | F. The sheriff of Pointe Coupee Parish has already initiated a reentry project |
| 27 | at the Pointe Coupee Detention Center through a public-private venture. The |
| 28 | legislature believes that establishing a pilot program at this local facility would be |
| 29 | an efficient use of available resources. |

| 1 | G. In balancing the legitimate needs of law enforcement agencies and the |
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| 2 | desire to facilitate reentry opportunities to individuals who have paid their debts to |
| 3 | society, the Legislature of Louisiana enacts the provisions of this Part and authorizes |
| 4 | the sheriff for the parish of Pointe Coupee to implement a pilot program which shall |
| 5 | be called the "Offender Reentry Support Pilot Program". |
| 6 | §745.2. Offender Reentry Support Pilot Program; establishment; participating |
| 7 | correctional institution; content; administration; implementation; reporting |
| 8 | A. The "Offender Reentry Support Pilot Program" is hereby created and |
| 9 | established within the Pointe Coupee Sheriff's Office. |
| 10 | B. The program shall consist of all of the following components: |
| 11 | (1) An Offender Rehabilitation and Accountability Plan that is specific to |
| 12 | each offender housed at the Pointe Coupee Detention Center and provides for all of |
| 13 | the following: |
| 14 | (a) Engages the offender personally in the transition to release, sets clear and |
| 15 | defined goals and expectations, and affords access to programs and services that will |
| 16 | meet the individual's assessed risks and needs. |
| 17 | (b) Assists the offender in resolving any behavioral issues he may have, |
| 18 | including access to counseling for substance abuse, anger and aggression, antisocial |
| 19 | behavior, cognitive deficits, domestic violence, and lack of parenting skills all as |
| 20 | needed by the offender. |
| 21 | (c) Assesses the offender throughout incarceration to determine progress and |
| 22 | achievement of the goals and expectations established for that offender. |
| 23 | (d) Introduces the offender to stakeholders in the community where the |
| 24 | offender will be returning upon release to reinforce law-abiding and responsible |
| 25 | behavior. |
| 26 | (2) An education and job skills training plan specific to each offender housed |
| 27 | at the Pointe Coupee Detention Center. Education and training provided within this |
| 28 | plan shall be developed in partnership with employers and educational institutions |
| 29 | within Pointe Coupee Parish, and any other appropriate parishes, to ensure that the |

| 1 | types of instruction provided aligns with the needs of employers in the region that |
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| 2 | are willing to hire ex-offenders. When possible and appropriate, transitional |
| 3 | on-the-job training should occur prior to release from incarceration. |
| 4 | (3) An employment preparation plan that, prior to release, will provide the |
| 5 | offender with skills training that addresses proper work ethic, communication, |
| 6 | attitude, personal responsibility, and workplace culture. If required, the offender |
| 7 | shall receive instruction in completing computerized applications, assistance with |
| 8 | resume development, or assistance in job searches. The Louisiana Workforce |
| 9 | Commission shall assist the Pointe Coupee Sheriff's Office in providing these |
| 10 | services. |
| 11 | (4) A post-release support plan that will provide each ex-offender a single |
| 12 | point of contact for assistance with the needs and challenges that are encountered |
| 13 | after being discharged from the detention center. This assistance shall be made |
| 14 | available to the ex-offender for a period of twelve months following release. Support |
| 15 | provided shall include, at a minimum and as needed, help in obtaining the following: |
| 16 | (a) Necessary identification documents. |
| 17 | (b) Housing. |
| 18 | (c) Transportation. |
| 19 | (d) Substance abuse treatment. |
| 20 | (e) Family and domestic violence counseling. |
| 21 | (f) Parenting. |
| 22 | (g) Health care. |
| 23 | (h) Child care. |
| 24 | (i) Insurance. |
| 25 | C. The sheriff is hereby authorized to research potential funding sources for |
| 26 | this pilot program and obtain funds from any federal, state, and local sources |
| 27 | available for such initiatives as are developed and undertaken by the program. Such |
| 28 | funds shall be used exclusively for the purposes of the program. |
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| 2 | "Offender Reentry Support Pilot Program", the sheriff shall submit to the House |
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| 3 | Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice and the Senate Committee on |
| 4 | Judiciary C a comprehensive report regarding the implementation of the pilot |
| 5 | program, funding obtained for its implementation, the progress of offenders and |
| 6 | ex-offenders under the program, and a recommendation for continuation, expansion, |
| 7 | or termination of the program. |
| 8 | §745.3. Advisory council; establishment; duties; membership |
| 9 | A. To assist with the creation, development and implementation of the |
| 10 | "Offender Reentry Support Pilot Program", the sheriff shall create and appoint |
| 11 | members to an advisory council. The council will assist the sheriff in the |
| 12 | formulation of offender reentry strategies for the design of inmate education, |
| 13 | treatment, and rehabilitation programs to provide sufficient skills to offenders that |
| 14 | will likely result in their successful employment and reentry into their communities, |
| 15 | reducing their chances of returning to prison after release. |
| 16 | B. The programs shall be developed after evaluation and identification of the |
| 17 | specific needs for reentry services within the detention center. The advisory council |
| 18 | shall monitor these programs for their effectiveness and the outcomes achieved as |
| 19 | they relate to such strategies. The sheriff may use any necessary resources of state |
| 20 | and local agencies, academic institutions, and other research organizations to develop |
| 21 | the strategies. |
| 22 | C. The advisory council's membership shall be from the region served by the |
| 23 | sheriff's office and shall consist of the following members: |
| 24 | (1) Two representatives having managerial and business experience. |
| 25 | (2) A representative from the Greater Pointe Coupee Chamber of Commerce. |
| 26 | (3) Representatives from each of the educational and training institutions in |
| 27 | the region. |
| 28 | (4) Three representatives from community service organizations. |

D. Within twenty-four months following initial implementation of the

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(5) Representatives from any state and local agencies relevant to addressing

the pre-release and post-release needs of offenders.

Thibaut HB No. 781

Abstract: Creates the Offender Reentry Support Pilot Program in Pointe Coupee Parish.

<u>Present law</u> provides for reentry programs for offenders housed in the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections facilities.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains these provisions of <u>present law</u> and extends reentry programs to offenders housed in local jails through the creation of the Offender Reentry Support Pilot Program to be operated in Pointe Coupee Parish.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the program shall include all of the following components:

- (1) An offender rehabilitation and accountability plan providing for defined goals following incarceration, resolution of any behavioral issues, and introduction to community leaders where the offender will be released.
- (2) An educational and job skills training plan providing vocational and on the job training prior to release.
- (3) An employment preparation plan providing work skills, communication, attitude, and personal responsibility.
- (4) A post-release support plan including housing plans, health care, insurance, transportation, and substance abuse treatment.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a report from the sheriff to the legislature regarding the implementation of the pilot program.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for an advisory council appointed by the sheriff to assist with the operation of the program.
