- 16 "D. The remedies and rights provided pursuant to this Section are in addition to and do not preclude any remedy otherwise available under law. 17 18
 - E. Any person who is found liable pursuant to the provisions of this Section in an action brought by the attorney general shall be liable to the attorney general for all costs, expenses, and fees related to investigations and proceedings associated with the violation, including attorney fees. An action to recover costs, expenses, fees, and attorney fees shall be ancillary to, and shall be brought and heard in the same court as the civil action brought pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter.
 - F. The attorney general may examine, or cause to be examined by agents thereof, without notice, the conditions and affairs of any person subject to the provisions of this Section. In connection with an examination, the attorney general or his agents may examine under oath any person subject to the provisions of this Section and any director, officer, employee, customer, creditor, manager, member, partner, or stockholder of any person subject to the provisions of this Section concerning the affairs and business of the person. The person shall pay the reasonable costs of the examination as determined by the attorney general which shall be deposited in the state treasury for credit to the office of the attorney general. Failure to pay the examination fee within 30 days after receipt of demand from the attorney general shall automatically suspend the right of the person to do business
