## DIGEST

Riser (SB 214)

<u>Present law</u> provides for the number of assistant district attorneys for the various judicial districts.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the number of assistant district attorneys in particular judicial districts as follows:

- (1)  $5^{\text{th}} \text{ JDC } \underline{\text{from}} 6 \underline{\text{to}} 7.$
- (2)  $6^{\text{th}} \text{ JDC } \underline{\text{from}} 7 \underline{\text{to}} 8.$
- (2)  $7^{\text{th}}$  JDC from 5 to 6.
- (3)  $14^{\text{th}}$  JDC from 23 to 24.
- (4)  $16^{\text{th}} \text{ JDC } \underline{\text{from}} 21 \underline{\text{to}} 22.$
- (5)  $19^{\text{th}}$  JDC from 48 to 50.
- (6)  $20^{\text{th}}$  JDC from 5 to 6.
- (7)  $21^{\text{st}}$  JDC <u>from</u> 18 to 19.
- (8)  $24^{\text{th}}$  JDC <u>from</u> 52 to 54.
- (9)  $29^{\text{th}}$  JDC <u>from</u> 9 to 10.
- (10)  $36^{\text{th}}$  JDC from 4 to 5.
- (11)  $37^{\text{th}}$  JDC from 2 to 3.

Effective on August 1, 2014, provided that funding for the additional 14 assistant district attorney positions is appropriated and payable out of the state general fund in the general appropriations bill for the state.
